ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14(1) AMENDED
BY THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991
(LONG DRIVE, ACTON, LONDON W3)
(TEMPORARY WAITING RESTRICTION)
(NOTICE OF MAKING)

1. THE Council of the London Borough of Ealing being the traffic authority for Long Drive, Acton, London W3, HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate safer access for the vehicles involved in the supply of building materials and disposal of waste at the adjacent Perryn School redevelopment works, it has made an Order, the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicular traffic from waiting on part of the said road, which extends between a point opposite to common boundary of property nos. 45 & 47 and another point opposite to common boundary of property nos. 96 & 98.
2. No person shall, until the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to wait, load or unload on northern side of the said length of Long Drive.
3. Whilst the temporary restrictions (operative on Mon - Fri, between 6.00 AM - 6.00 PM) remain in force, displaced vehicular traffic should follow advance warning and diversion signs displayed and any other traffic management (including the guidance of banksman) in place wherever necessary on site to reach their desired destination or to find alternative parking places.
4. Nothing in the Order shall apply to any thing done: -
 - a) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a police community support officer;
 - b) to any vehicle being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or
 - c) to any vehicle being used in connection with the execution of the said works.
5. The Order, which will have a maximum duration of 18 months, will come into operation on Monday 30th June 2008. The said works are scheduled to commence on Monday 30th June 2008 and are expected to be completed within 3 months.
