

## Central Ealing Neighbourhood Plan Decision Statement

## Summary

Following an independent examination (including a Hearing) and decision at its Cabinet on 13th June 2017, London Borough of Ealing confirms that the Central Ealing Neighbourhood Plan will proceed to referendum on 12 October 2017. The referendum area has been extended to 10 electoral wards surrounding the plan area and, as this is a Business Neighbourhood Plan, there will be two referendums – one for residents and one for businesses.

## **Background**

London Borough of Ealing designated the Central Ealing as a neighbourhood and business area for the purpose of preparing a neighbourhood plan in accordance with Part Two of the Town and Country Planning (England) Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012. Following formal submission of the Plan to London Borough of Ealing it was publicised and representations invited.

London Borough of Ealing appointed an independent examiner, Mr John Parmiter, to conduct an examination into whether the Plan meets the basic conditions and should proceed to referendum. The examiner's report concludes that, subject to making the minor modifications recommended by the examiner, the Plan meets the basic conditions set out in the legislation and should proceed to a referendum.

## **Decision and reasons**

At a meeting of the London Borough of Ealing's Cabinet on 13th June 2017 it was agreed that the Plan should proceed to a referendum.

Having considered the Plan and the Examiner's report, London Borough of Ealing has agreed to make the modifications to the draft Plan as set out in the Cabinet Report link below.
