

Central Ealing Neighbourhood Plan Referendums

Information Statement

Two Referendums, one Residential Referendum and one Business Referendum, relating to the adoption of the Central Ealing Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 12 October 2017.

The question which will be asked in both Referendums is:

“Do you want Ealing Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Central Ealing to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”

The Referendum area and Central Ealing neighbourhood area are identified on the map included with this information statement.

A person is entitled to vote in the Residential Referendum if on 26 September 2017

- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the Referendum area; and
- his or her qualifying address is in the Referendum area.

A business is entitled to vote in the Business Referendum if on 27 September 2017

- the business is a non-domestic ratepayer in the Referendum area; and
- the business has registered a named voter as their business vote holder on the business voting register.

(The Business Registration Officer will invite all eligible businesses to register a named voter on the business voting register from 9 August 2017).

The overall expenses limit that will apply in relation to both Referendums, and the number of persons by reference to which that limit has been calculated, shall be published and made available as soon as practicable after the initial registration list is received by the Business Registration Officer.

The Referendums will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.

The following is a list of specified documents associated with the Referendums:

- The Central Ealing Neighbourhood Development Plan;
- A map of the Referendum area and Central Ealing neighbourhood area;
- The report made by the independent examiner, including a summary of any representations submitted to the independent examiner;
- A statement by Ealing Council Planning Authority that the draft plan meets the basic conditions and complies with the relevant legislation;
- This information statement;
- A statement that sets out general information about the planning system and neighbourhood plans.
