

West Ealing Centre Neighbourhood Plan Decision Statement

Summary

Following an independent examination and decision at its Cabinet on 16th January 2018, Ealing Council confirms that the West Ealing Centre Neighbourhood Plan will proceed to referendum on 3 May 2018. The referendum area matches the plan area and, as this is a Business Neighbourhood Plan, there will be two referenda – one for residents and one for businesses.

Background

Ealing Council designated the West Ealing Centre as a neighbourhood and business area for the purpose of preparing a neighbourhood plan in accordance with Part Two of the Town and Country Planning (England) Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012. Following formal submission of the Plan to Ealing Council it was publicised and representations invited.

Ealing Council appointed an independent examiner, Jill Kingaby, to conduct an examination into whether the Plan met the basic conditions and if it should proceed to referendum. The examiner's report concludes that, subject to making the minor modifications recommended by the examiner, the Plan meets the basic conditions set out in the legislation and should proceed to referenda.

Decision and reasons

At a meeting of the Ealing's Cabinet on 16th January 2018 it was agreed that the Plan should proceed to referenda.

Having considered the Plan and the Examiner's report, Ealing Council has agreed to make the modifications to the draft Plan as set out in the Cabinet Report link below.
