We will address vulnerability and build confidence and resilience by:

Drivers

1) Focusing on Substance Misuse, Domestic Abuse and Mental Health

- Work across agencies and geographical areas to develop a comprehensive approach to tackling drug and alcohol related crime
- We will work as a partnership to maximise prevention opportunities to reduce the risk of people becoming vulnerable
- Tackle resident perception of these issues in order to develop better community treatment
- Improve our coordination of prevention activity and enable vulnerable groups to better support themselves
- Enhance the effectiveness, coordination and consistency of our approach to treatment and our treatment offer

2) Preventing Exploitation and Victimisation

- Prioritise tackling crime that exploits and victimises vulnerable groups (e.g. youth violence, knife crime, Prevent, CSE, VAWG, hate crime)
- Work more effectively as partners to strengthen our approaches to school exclusion and contextual safeguarding
- Prioritise protection and better outcomes for vulnerable groups, including children and those with mental and physical disabilities
- Increase community engagement across the borough to empower people to reduce crime and ASB in order to improve outcomes

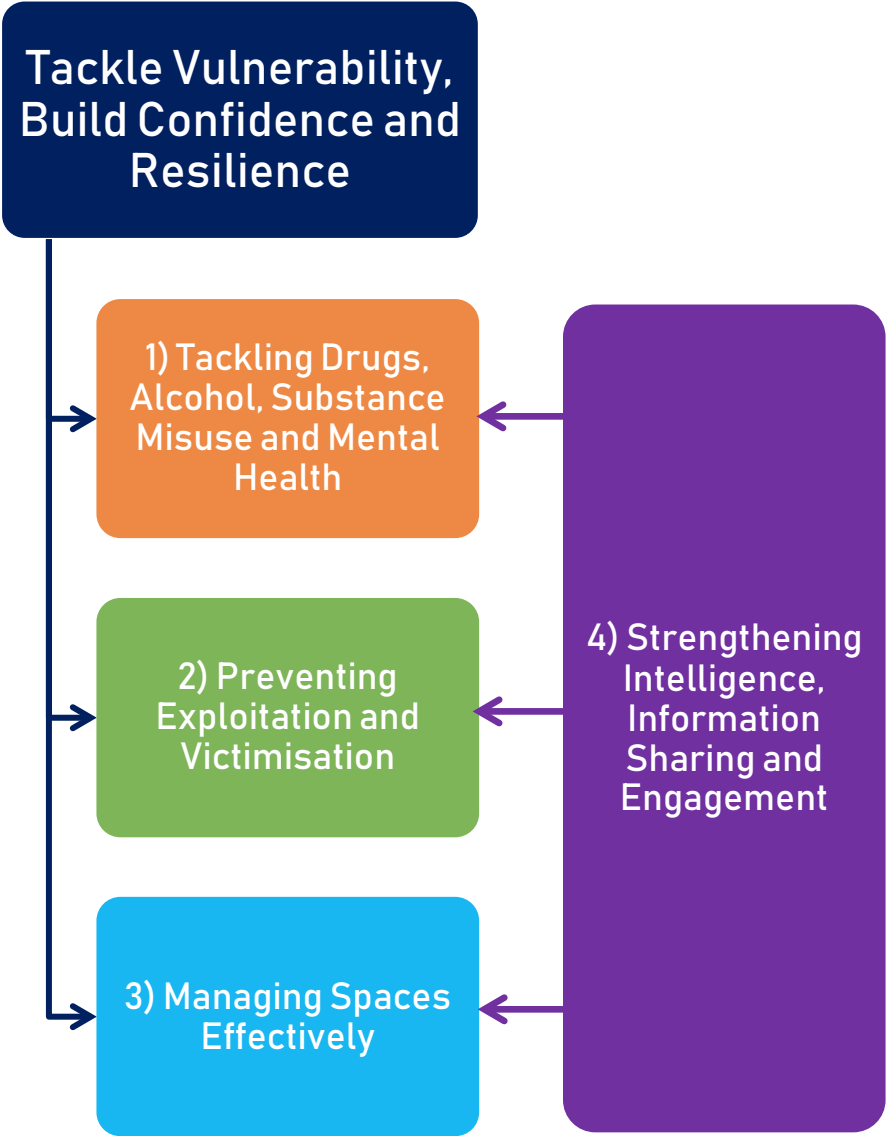
3) Managing Spaces Effectively

- Co-ordinate our patrolling resources to provide reassurance and reduce risk of violence and exploitation hotspots
- Work across borough borders to address crime and ASB, their underlying causes and enablers (e.g. County Lines, gang crime)
- Adopt a collective enforcement approach to risk hotspots, using our various powers to create better regulated spaces
- Communicate our work and success in a co-ordinated way to improve the perception of safety across our borough

4) Strengthening Intelligence, Information Sharing and Resilience

1. Commission effective research and analysis to understand drivers of problems and effectiveness of our solutions
2. Using our shared intelligence to identify and target interventions for high risk victims, perpetrators and locations
3. Tackle less visible drivers of harm: e.g. under-reported crime, domestic abuse, hate crime
4. Share information, communicate and engage effectively with local communities to help build community confidence and resilience, and engage communities with the work of the SEP

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We will take action to strengthen how we work together:

We will work with all private landowners to create more ownership of risk reduction
