Executive Summary

Introduction

Dean Gardens provides West Ealing with vital green space where local people can exercise, relax and meet friends. It is also a great place for children and young people to play and enjoy being out in nature. It's central location also makes it an ideal venue for community events.

In 2019 we developed plans to improve Dean Gardens as part of the Live West Ealing project to make West Ealing healthier and more pleasant for everyone. Due to the Covid19 Pandemic, the Transport for London funding for the park works has been frozen. At the same time, more local people have been visiting the park and this has resulted in lots more litter and greater wear and tear of the play area, the outdoor gym equipment and the lawns.

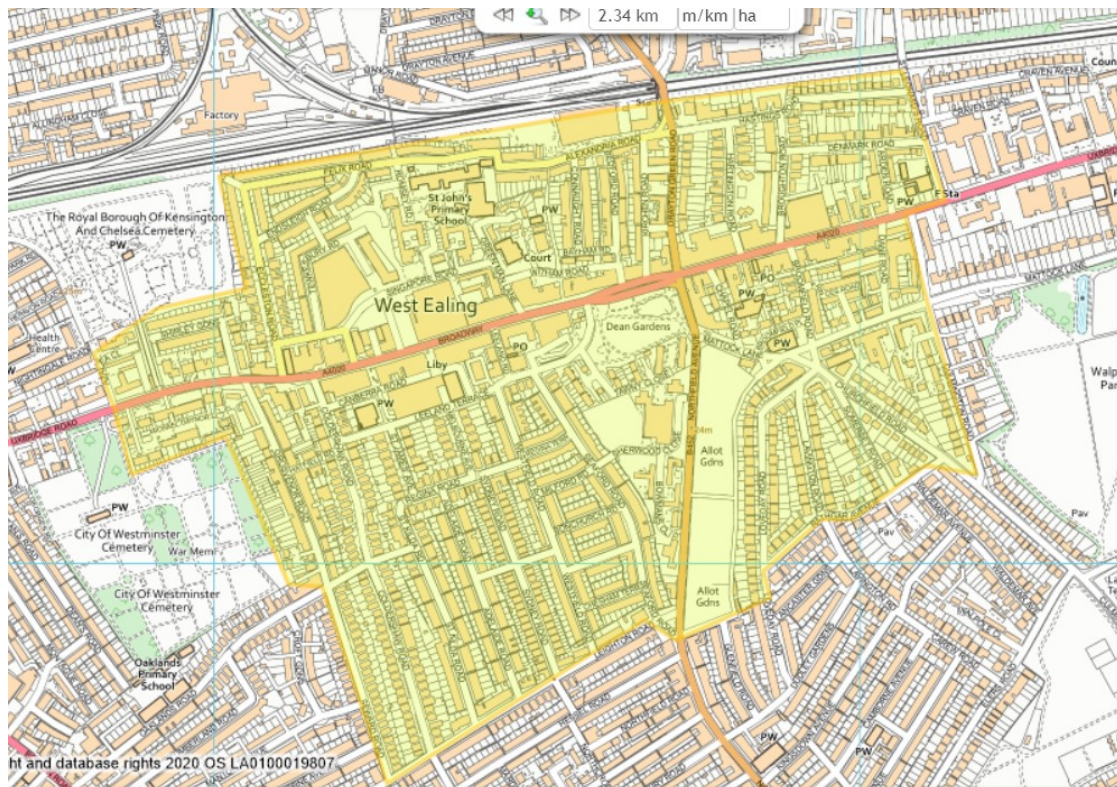
This consultation provided an opportunity for residents to comment on a range of small-scale park improvements that we could carry out in 2021-22 to make Dean Gardens better. These works could take place without closing the park and without affecting any longer-term visions for the park refurbishment.

The consultation

The consultation ran for 6 weeks starting on 26th July and ending on 30th August 2021. The consultation was run on-line using SurveyMonkey with links via the Ealing council website and paper copies were also available on request and at a drop-in session held in the park on 18th August from 10am to 12noon.

7141 leaflets about the consultation were sent out to local addresses. Posters to advertise the consultation put up in the park and at the Lido Centre but unfortunately West Ealing Library was closed due to the pandemic. Social media was used to advertise the consultation including Twitter and Facebook and the Council sent emails about the consultation to 8131 email subscribers. Stakeholder Groups for the West Ealing Liveable Neighbourhood Project were also all notified of the consultation and encouraged to respond.

Responses

843 people responded to the survey of which 837 responded online and 6 returned paper or scanned pdf responses. Around 30 people attended the onsite consultation event. All the results have been collated and details of responses to each question are included in this report. Most respondents told us visit the park regularly on their way to other destinations and that they are alone or with family members. They told us they most like the park for its green space, trees and flowers and its proximity to the shops and cafes. Respondents said they most disliked litter, they didn't feel safe in the park and that there are too many pigeons.

These results reflect broadly peoples 'likes' and 'dislikes' main about the park. Providing larger litter bins and CCTV upgrade will help to tackle the littering, pigeons and anti-social behaviour problems whilst installing logs, mounds and boulders, tree planting and community gardening will enhance the greenspace with trees and flowers, play naturally and learn about gardening. Improvements to the children's play area, the exercise area and repairs to the cycle path will then provide a wider range of complimentary activities for all ages and abilities.

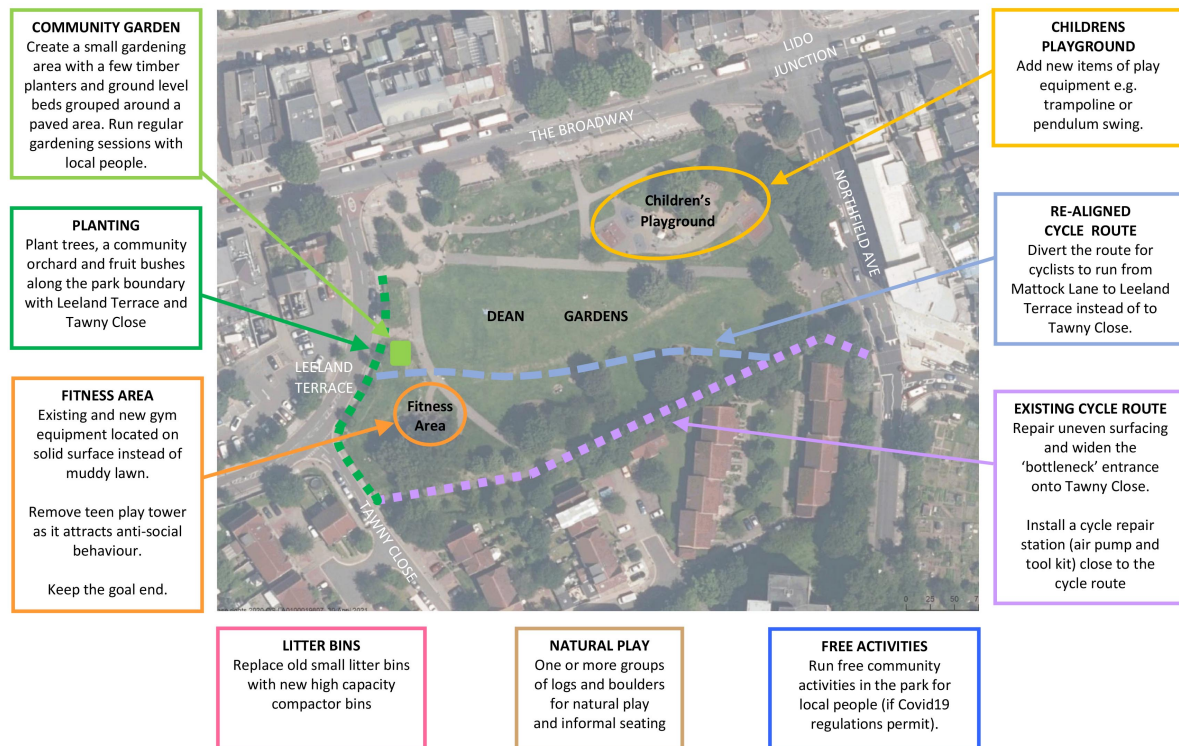
Ongoing and planned works not included in this survey - the council will be making further small repairs to the existing play area and will be planting new trees around the park in winter 2021-22 which will replace the trees removed in 2020.

What happens next

As there is good support for most proposals and there is funding is available through S106 developers' contributions for Dean Gardens. Improvement items with the highest level of support such as compactor bins, logs and mounds, CCTV upgrade and community gardening activities will go ahead first starting this winter. Moderately popular improvements will follow on starting in Spring 2022. Least popular items including realigning the cycle route, the cycle repair station, the power

bollard and distance markers will not go ahead yet. If funding becomes available in the future these items can be reviewed and could still go ahead subject to further community and stakeholder consultation.

Dean Gardens Park Improvements Ideas 2021

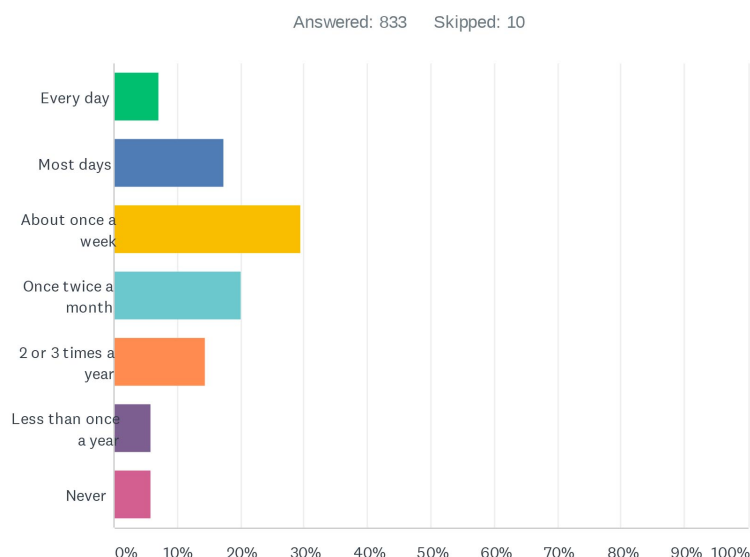


Survey Results

Q1 Approximately how often do you visit Dean Gardens?

Just under 30% of respondents visit about once a week, just over 20% visit once or twice a month, just over 17% visit most days whilst 14.5% said they visit 2-3 times a year. Just over 7% visit daily, almost 6% less than once a year and almost 6% said have never visited the park.

Q1 1) Approximately how often do you visit Dean Gardens?



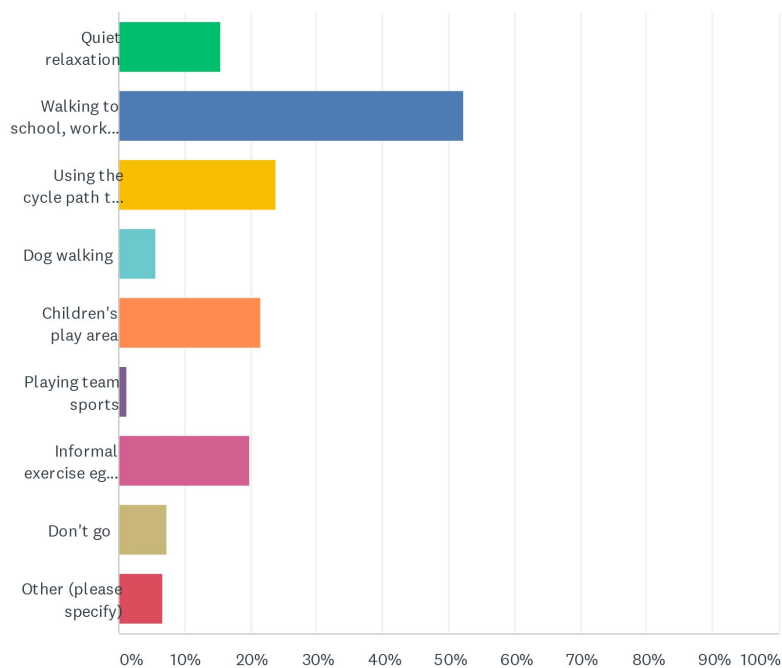
Q2 What is your reason for going to Dean Gardens?

The most popular reason for people to go to Dean Gardens with almost half of all respondents walking through it on their way to another destination such as school, shops, work or the station. Cycling through the park, the children's play area, doing informal exercise and using the park for quiet relaxation were also popular reasons. Very few respondents use the park for team sports and dog walking and 60 respondents said they don't visit the park. Respondents could select more than one answer from the list and could also give other reasons.

Other reasons people gave included attending local festivals and events in the park, walking through the park to avoid the busy main road, playing basketball, roller-skating and skateboarding and using the park as part of a longer walking or running route.

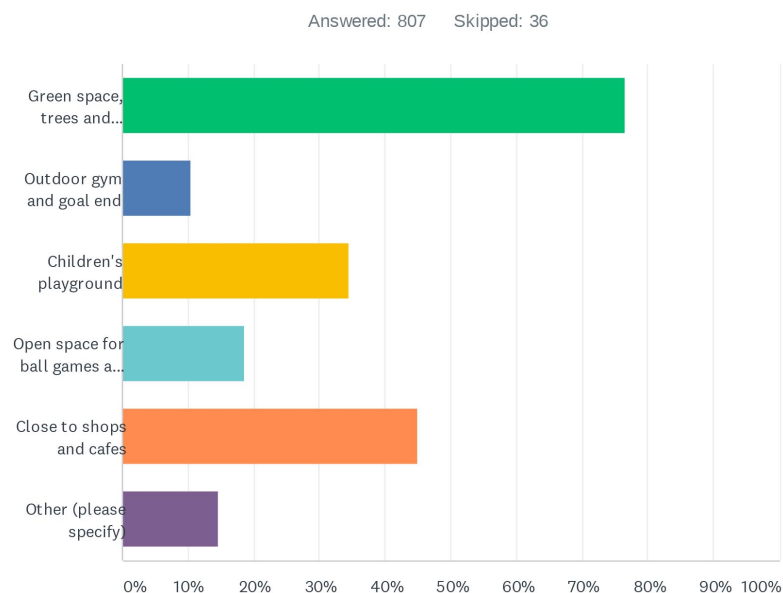


Q3 What do you like about the park?

Three quarters of respondents said they like the park for its green space, trees and flowers, whilst almost half said they liked the proximity to shops and cafes. And almost a third liked the playground. 1 in 5 of respondents said they liked the space for ball games and activities but only 1 in 10 said they like the outdoor gym and goal end. Respondents could select more than one answer from the list and could also give other reasons.

Other reasons people gave included the parks local history, that it is good space for local residents with no garden of their own, it's good safe cycling route for families avoiding busy main road, a place to escape from the traffic fumes, a green lung for West Ealing, using the basketball hoop, the wonderful willow tree, attending local festivals and the fun fair. 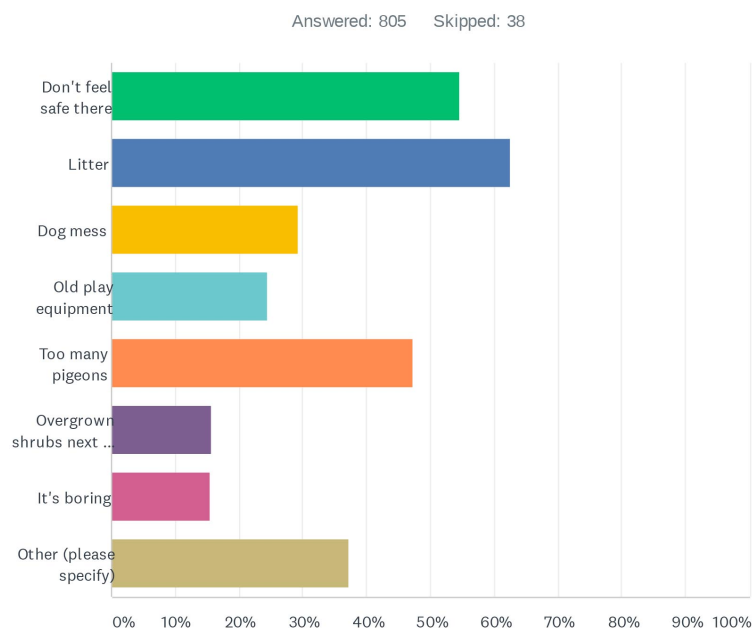
Q4 What do you not like about the park?

Litter was the item by far the most respondents disliked with 504 of the 853 respondents choosing this answer. Just over half (440) respondents said they do not feel safe in the park and just under a half of respondents (381) felt that there are too many pigeons in the park. A quarter of respondents were concerned about dog mess, just under a quarter old play equipment and there was also some concern about overgrown shrubs by the cycle route and the park being boring. Respondents could select more than one answer from the list and could also give other reasons.

By far the most popular other dislikes about the park that people gave were the high numbers of street drinkers and drug users who are in plain sight, use the park as a toilet and leave dangerous drug paraphernalia about. The huge numbers of pigeons and rats were also a concern to very many respondents.

Other dislikes included that the park feels neglected and run down, there are not enough flowers, the cycle route feels unsafe at night, the park suffers from traffic pollution, there are not enough trees and plants, uneven path surfaces are a trip risk, and there are not enough places to sit. 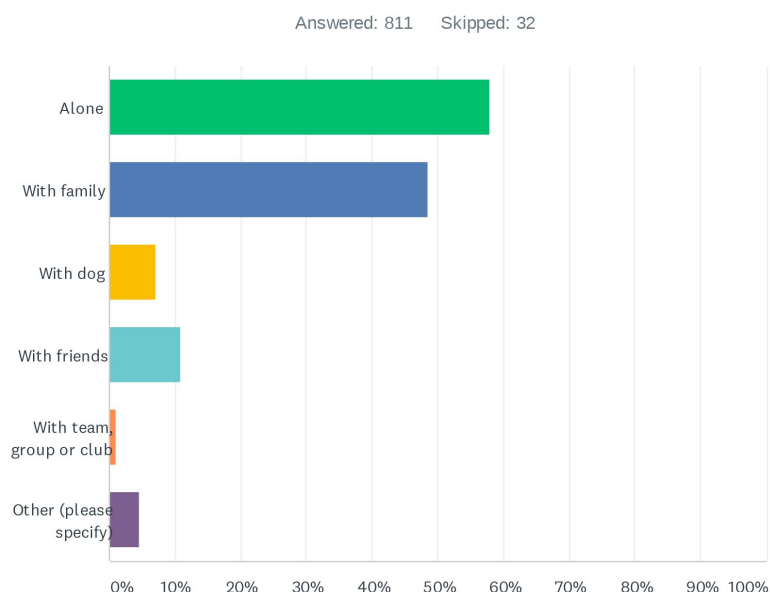


Q5 Who do you normally visit Dean Gardens with?

Over half of respondents told us they visit the park alone, and just under half visit with family. Only 1 in 8 respondents visit with friends, and even fewer with a team, group or club or visit with their dog.

Q6 Optional - please leave any general comments about Dean Gardens

452 people gave further comments on a wide range of topics many of which expanded on their responses to the previous questions. All of the following were common themes

- Tackle the ASB / to social problems first... And the pigeons!
- Dean Gardens is an important green space as there is nothing else in West Ealing.
- The Park is tired and run down and well overdue for improvements suitable for a town centre small space
- Improve the planting – add trees and flowers to attract nature and provide a calming and therapeutic greenspace
- Make it a priority park for families with small children
- Repair the historic fountain near the Lido Junction and add a drinking water fountain
- Keep the historic railings
- Involve the local schools in developing ideas for the park
- Move the play area further into park away from traffic pollution or screen it with a hedge
- Lock the park at night
- Bring back the public toilets
- Provide accessible play equipment
- More things for teens to do – where else can they go as developers won't provide Teen facilities
- Ensure adequate funds are in place for good for maintenance

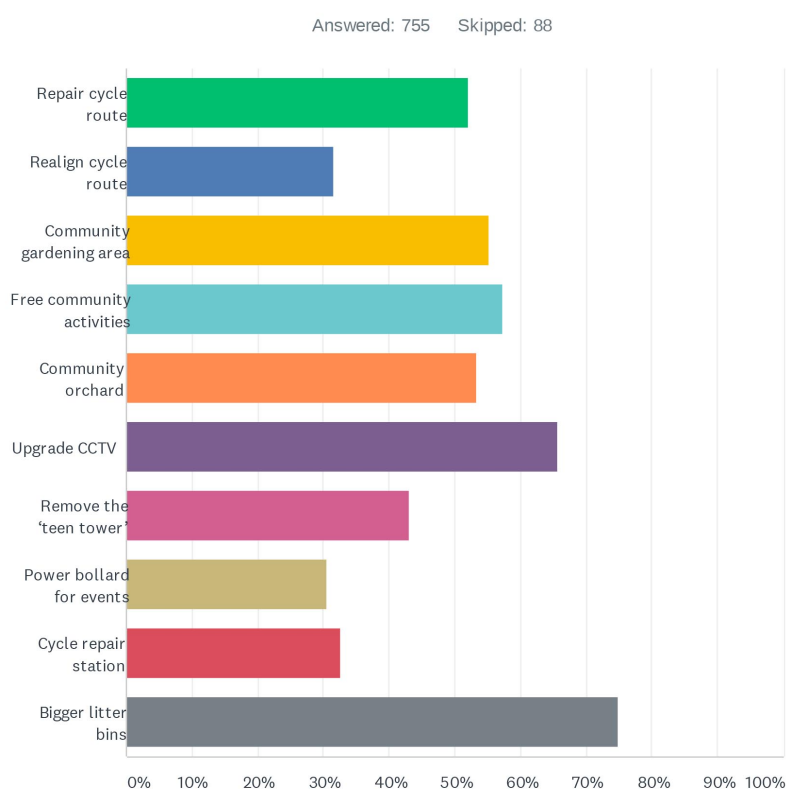

Q7 Which of the following improvements would you like to in the park?

Bigger compactor style litter bins and upgraded CCTV were the highest scoring choices with well over half of respondents selecting each of these choices. Free activities, a community gardening area, an orchard and repairing the existing cycle route were also popular with each selected by around half of respondents. Removing the teen tower was selected by around a third of respondents and least popular but still being chosen by around a quarter of respondents were realigning the cycle route, installing a power bollard for events and installing distance markers.

Q7 Which of the following improvements would you like to see in the park? You can check more than one box.



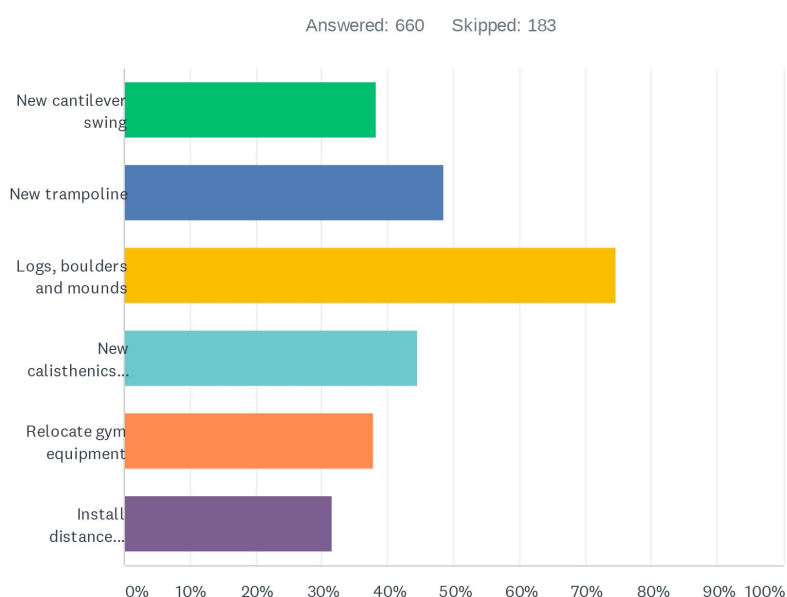

Q8 Which of the following play, sports and fitness improvements would you like to see in the park? You can tick as many boxes as you like.

Logs, boulders and mounds was by far the most popular choice with three quarters (745) of respondents selecting this option. A ground level trampoline and a calisthenics exercise frame were also popular getting votes from over 40% of respondents each. The cantilever swing and relocating the existing gym equipment away from the muddy lawn were selected by just under 40% of respondents. Distance markers for jogging and walking was only selected by 30% of respondent.

Combined Q7 and Q8 results

Combining and comparing the scores for 'Q7 park improvements' and 'Q8 play, sports and fitness improvements' shows the following priorities. Bigger, compactor-style litter bins, upgraded CCTV and providing logs and boulders for informal play and seating were all very popular with well over half of respondents selecting each of these choices. Free activities, a community gardening area, an orchard and repairing the existing cycle route were also popular and each was selected by around half of respondents. Removing the teen tower and providing new play equipment and gym equipment were all popular with around a third of respondents. Least popular but still being chosen by around a

quarter of respondents were realigning the cycle route, installing a power bollard for events and installing distance markers.

Q9 Optional - Are there any other improvements that you would like to see in the park? If so please tell us about your idea and why you are suggesting it.

344 respondents left comments and suggestions for other improvements including the following common themes

- Dean Gardens needs a distinctive character that is different from other parks in Ealing and is relevant to West Ealing and its community
- Improve maintenance
- Pond and nature area and insect friendly planting
- More things for teens to do
- Informal play opportunities such as natural play, ground markings and games
- Accessible swing / swing seat
- Better lighting
- Bring back the toilets
- Recycling facilities
- Colourful planting beds and planting to filter traffic pollution
- Separate the cyclists from pedestrian footpaths
- A small picnic area and refreshments kiosk
- Keep the historic railings

The council wishes to realign the cycle route on the southern boundary of the park so that it connects Mattock Lane with Leeland Terrace as part of Ealing's strategic cycle network. The new route would follow the edge of the main lawn away from the trees. The existing path will be retained as a footpath.

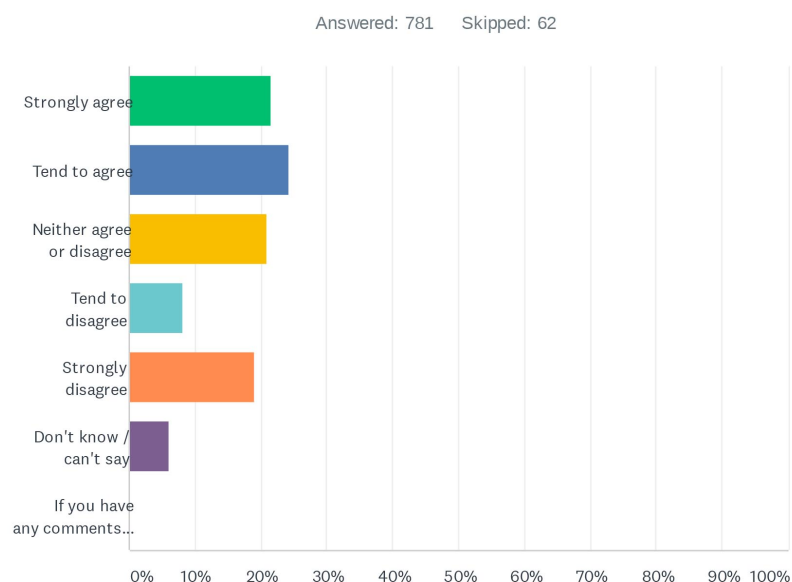
Q10 To what extent do you agree or disagree with this proposal?

There were 781 responses to this question and results were close with over 20% of respondents selecting each of the 'strongly agree', 'tend to agree', 'neither agree or disagree' and 'strongly disagree', whilst under 10% selected 'tend to disagree' or 'don't know/can't say' and 7% skipped this question.

Once the results are grouped this gives 42.59% agreeing with the proposal to realign the cycle route in some form, 25.15% disagreeing in some form and 32.27 remaining neutral or not able to say. So overall this survey shows there is clear support for realigning the cycle route.

But it should also be noted that in the responses to the earlier questions Q7 and Q8 the option for realigning the cycle route came in very low at 14th out of the 16 suggested park improvements. This suggests that at present it should not be considered a priority and this is also reflected in the comments given in Q11 below.

Q11 comments about the proposed cycle route realignment

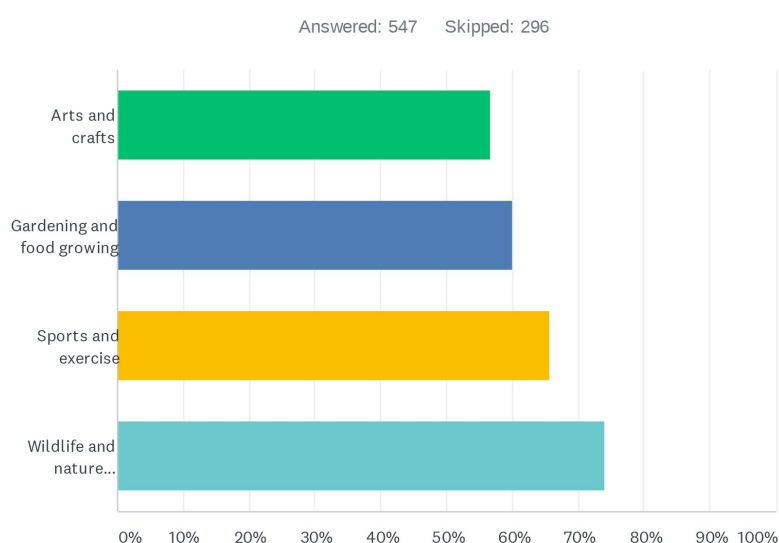
289 respondents commented further on this topic with the majority of respondents not agreeing with the realignment proposal, saying they think it is pointless and that repairing the existing route would be a better use of funds. Some respondents were also very concerned that the new route could be a risk to pedestrians and park users whilst others are concerned at the loss of greenspace to tarmac and that it will reduce the central green space which is used for events. The responses in support of the realignment told us they would feel safer and more visible using a route on the edge of the lawn. There were also a few requests for the existing cycle route to have much clearer markings and better lighting and for some sort of safe cycling enforcement in the park. Q12 As part of this project we will provide some free activities in the park. What type of activities would you like to take part in? You can check more than one box.

The most popular free activities people want to see in the park are wildlife and nature activities with 405 respondents wanting this option. Sports and Exercise activities came next with 359 votes, then Gardening and food growing activities with 328 votes and finally Arts and Crafts Activities with 310 votes.

109 respondents suggested other activities and left comments. These included

- Exercise, yoga, healthy living, mind/body/spirit classes and events
- Children's cycle lessons, cycle maintenance classes,
- Counselling and outreach for homeless people using the park
- Activities for teens

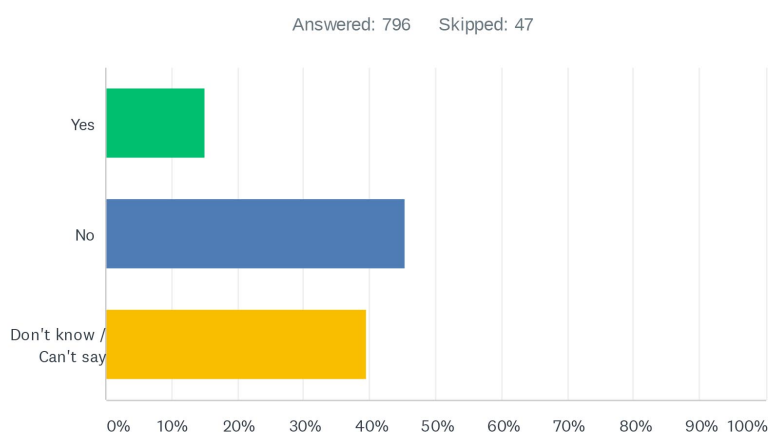
How can you help your park?

We are looking for volunteers to help look after Dean Gardens. Local people can make a real difference by helping us to keep the park looking clean and tidy, suggesting improvements, applying for community funding and reporting any problems.

120 respondents said they would be interested in volunteering in Dean Gardens or another green space close by, whilst 361 said they would not and 315 didn't know or couldn't say.

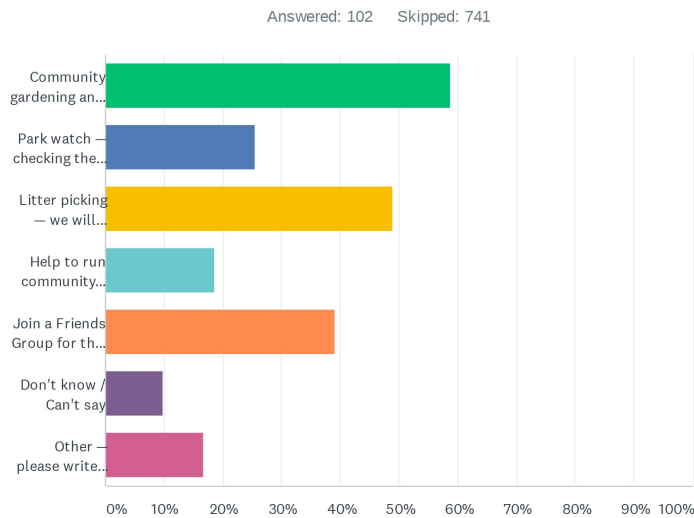
99 respondents provided their contact details which the council will only to contact them about the volunteering opportunities chosen in questions 16-18.

Community gardening and caring for fruit trees was the most popular choice with 60 people selecting it, followed by litter picking (50 people) and joining a Friends Group (40 people). Helping with a 'park watch' to regularly check the park was selected by 26 people whilst 19 said they'd like to help run community activities in the park.

Q16 What activities would you like to help us with in Dean Gardens?

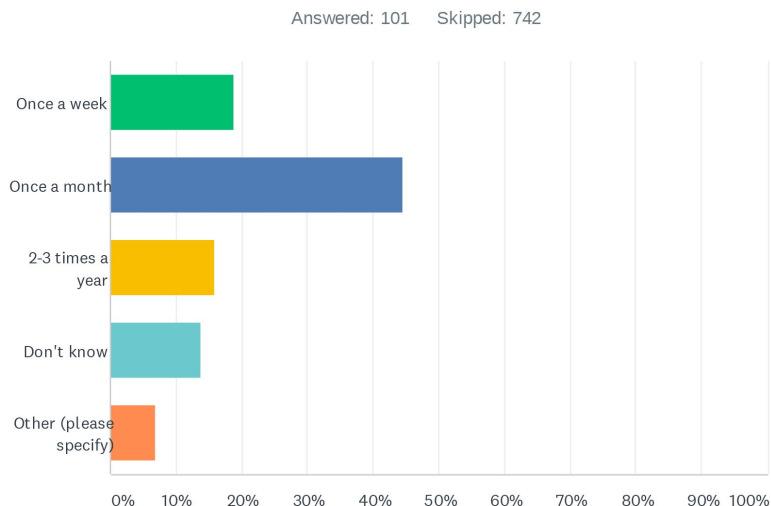


Other suggestions included setting up a park 'working party' to do small tasks, repairs etc. Community music events. 'Good Gym' volunteering activities, to run free yoga classes, to help with marketing/media for the park.

Once a month was the most popular response and was selected by 45 people. 19 people selected once a week and 16 selected 2-3 times a year.

Ealing Council can provide support for community-led greening projects. We are looking for enthusiastic individuals and community groups who want to transform local spaces for the better in your neighbourhood.

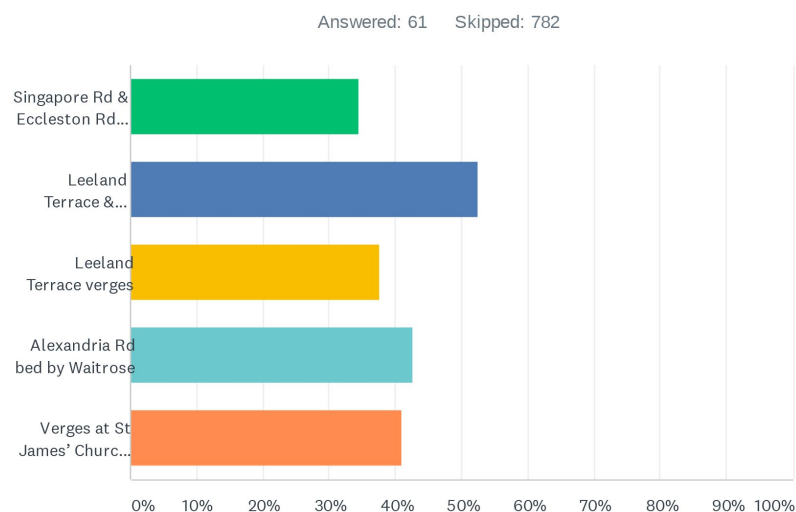
Local people tell us that there are a several ‘forgotten’ spaces in West Ealing that suffer from anti-social behaviour, fly tipping, littering and have become eyesores. With a little help these areas could be transformed into attractive green spaces that are great for people and nature.

61 respondents told us they would like to help transform other small green spaces in West Ealing with 32 people selecting Leeland Terrace/Seaford Road corner bed, 26 wanting to help with the Alexandria Road bed by Waitrose entrance, 25 people selecting the verges by St James Church, 23 people wanting to help with verge on Leeland Terrace and 21 selecting the Singapore Road/Eccleston Road corner bed.

Local volunteers have also been in touch with West Ealing Neighbours Group about volunteering to help transform some of these sites.

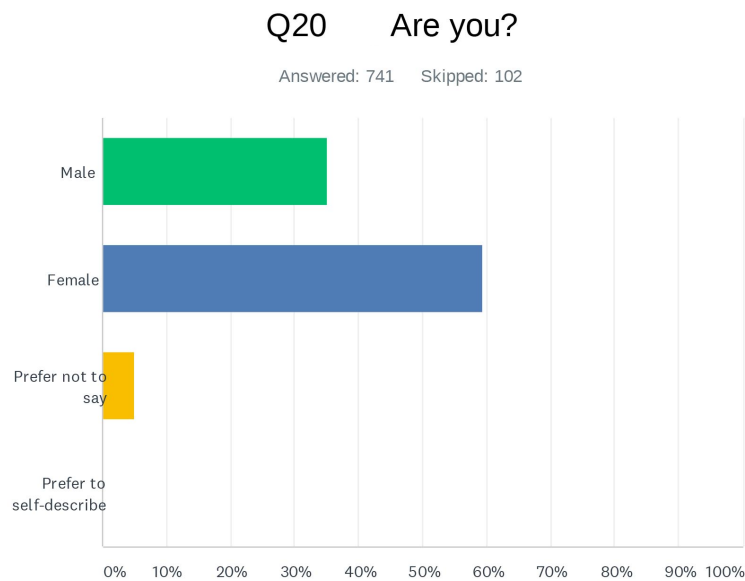
675 of the 853 respondents provided their postcode. The vast majority of respondents live in W13 and W5 but a few responses came from W7, W3, TW8 and UB5 postcodes which may reflect the fact that Dean Gardens is located in a busy town centre close to bus routes and to West Ealing railway station.

More females than males responded with 59% female to 35% male respondents, whilst 5% preferred not to say and under 1% prefer to self-describe



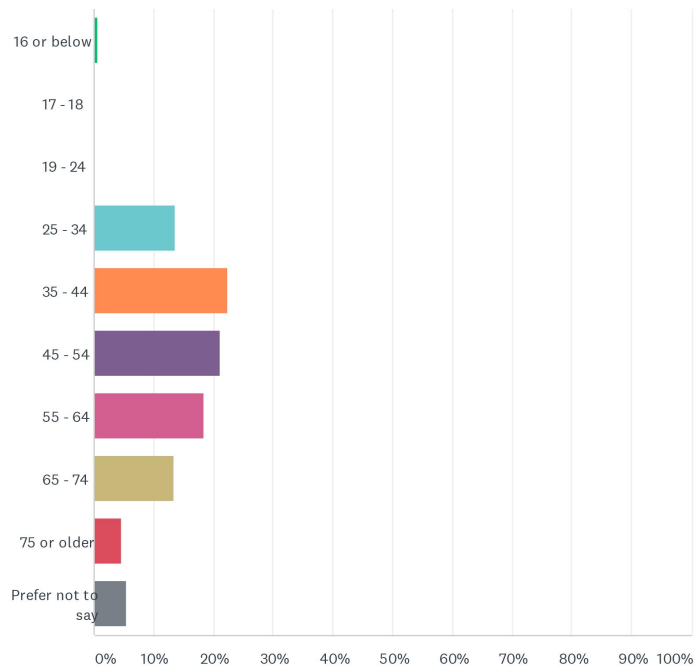

Q21 Your Age

There was a good spread of responses from all the adult age groups, with most respondents in the 35-44yrs and 45-54yrs age groups, and the 55-64yrs and 25-34yrs age groups also well represented. 133 respondents were aged 65 or older, but only 4 respondents were aged 16 or younger, just 1 respondent was in the 17-18yrs age group and only 2 in the 19-24yrs age group.

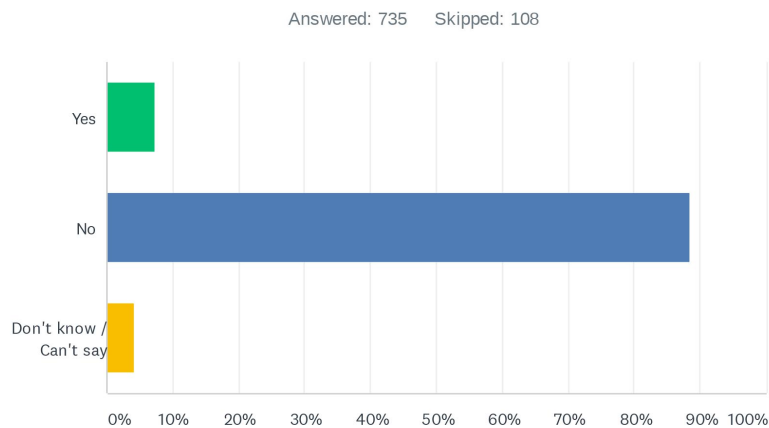

**Q23 How many children and teenagers live in your household?

There are a large number of children and teenagers in the households of respondents. 184 households have one or more under 5s, 100 households have one or more 6–9-year-olds, 81 have one or more 10–13-year-olds and 69 households have one or more 14–16-year-olds. But over 400 respondents said they have no children or teens in their households. There are at least 280 children aged 0-5yrs in households of respondents, at least 130 children aged 6-9yrs, at least 107 children aged 10-13yrs and at least 91 children aged 14-16yrs in households of respondents to this survey.

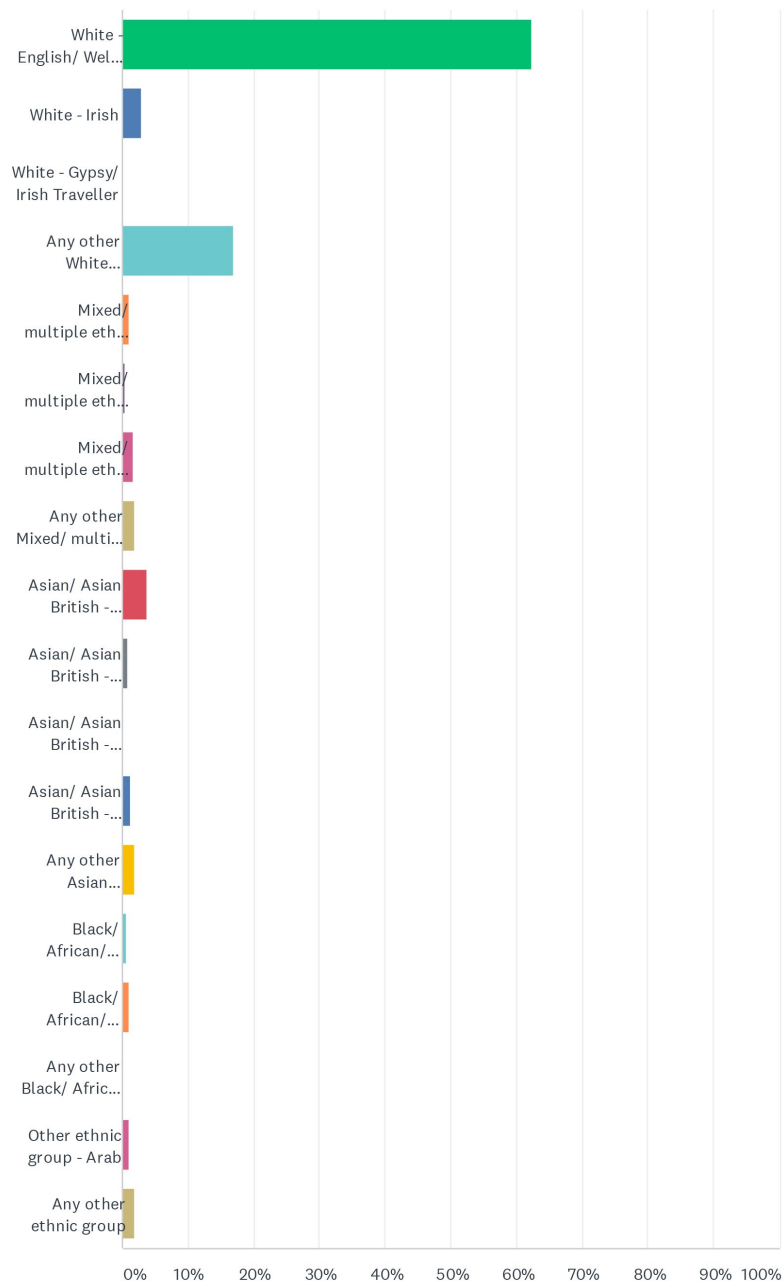

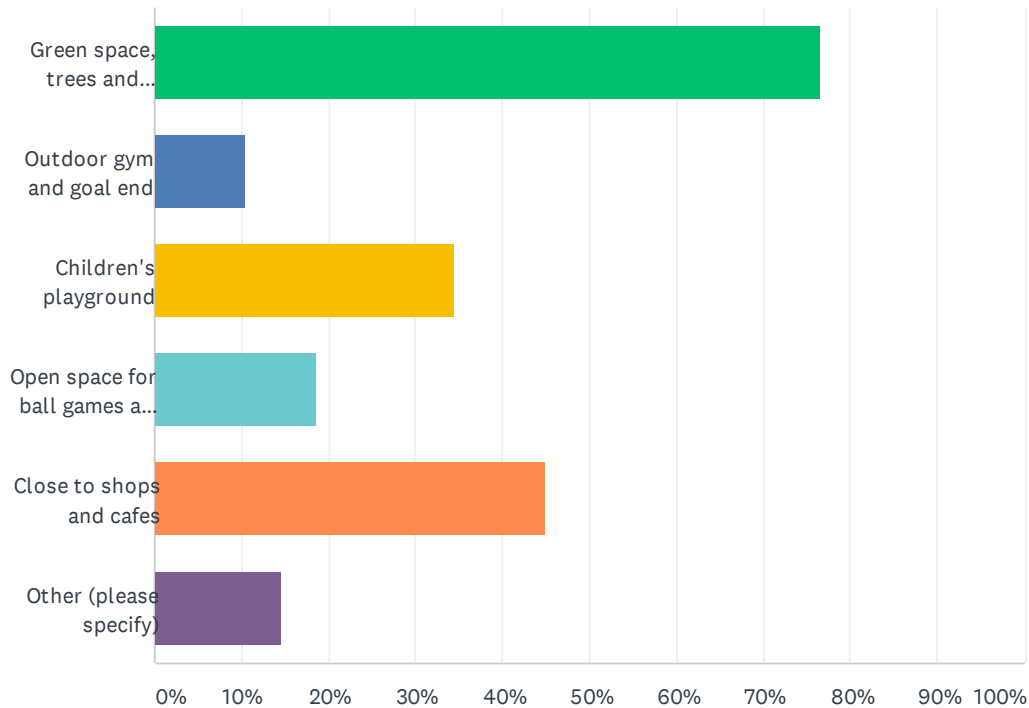

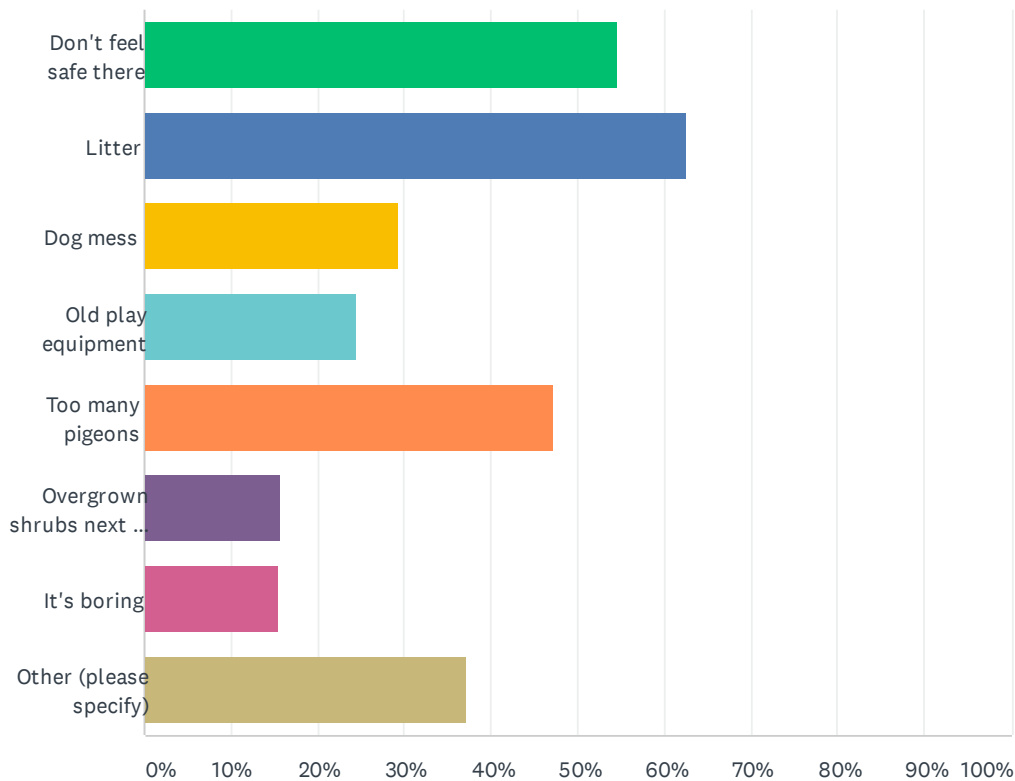
