PUBLIC CONSULTATION RESULTS RECTORY PARK PLAY AREA

Rectory Park is an open space, located at Parkfield Drive (off Church Road) Ealing Northolt Middlesex UB5 6SB. It is in the London Borough of Ealing.

Ideas for this park include a redesigned more compact layout and exciting new play equipment for all ages and abilities. We will ensure that the design is sympathetic to the area and a range of materials will be used to blend the area into its surroundings.

The consultation period for Rectory Park ran for 6 weeks ending on 24 September 2021.

The following are the results from the consultation survey.

Summary

3100 leaflets were sent out together with social media alerts which were used to advertise the consultation including twitter, Facebook and a press release was issued.


101 people responded to the online survey.


The consultation area boundary:



Conceptual masterplan for the site which was included in the consultation















Over 78.35% of people agreed with the creation of a new play zone near the skate area.





council and thank you for reaching out. I visit the park and spend some time in the play area on a daily basis, so I thought to reach out. It's fantastic to know my council wants to hear my opinion.

4.8 If you have any comments/ideas regarding the design layout or activities please write them below:

- What is missing is an outdoor gym for adults and a resting area with fixed benches and tables. Where do adults sit/ wait/ rest when children play?
- Improve what is there but don't make the area any bigger. The area sorely lacks any nice landscaped gardens and quiet areas that can be enjoyed by all and not just families and children.
- Please do not reduce the play area space. With the amount of new builds in the area the play area should be spacious not reduced to avoid overcrowding.
- My worry would be vandalism and how the equipment would be treated.
- A bench with metal roof to sit under for supervising mothers with young kids during rain and hot weather. Need some swing r play area for wheelchair users
- The infant area should be fenced off and gated so that toddlers cannot run off into the older children areas.
- Play areas in rectory Park are used by children of all ages. For some children, that's the only physical activity they have in a week. Instead of compacting the play area, the authorities should be investing in making it bigger, wider with better and advanced equipment. To make it more safe and secure, the area could be moved a bit forward from its original position and the bushes/hedges around it should be trimmed below waist level for better visibility. More space should be created for parents seating area and picnic areas so families can enjoy and supervise at the same time. Unfortunately, the other grass areas in the park are in constant use as pitches for cricket matches. It's sometimes difficult to even walk through to play area. That needs to be addressed. It is vital that more areas and exercise equipment is provided for children so kids can avoid too much screen time, get out of homes and reconnect with nature in the parks. This will not only be beneficial for their physical health but also mental health. Thank you.

- The more natural stuff the better. It needs to be hard wearing, and flimsy stuff will not do. I don't know how long ago the current play area was built, perhaps it is age that has made it decay so badly, or perhaps the materials were poorly chosen. The floor in the infant area is all pitted and broken and gets covered in moss, and you can see where attempts have been made to patch the holes and it just gets even worse. The park gets very busy even in its current dilapidated state, so I do not think that making it smaller is a good idea, although it would make sense to fully enclose the infant area to stop them from running off. There have

been many new housing developments built recently so the local population is increasing and there will be more and more demand for high quality, clean and safe places for kids to play. The park could easily be very beautiful, there are lots of gorgeous trees and things already in situ that you should make use of. Please get rid of the enormous pile of melted wheelie bins that are in a fenced off area next to the infant area, also the 'conservation area' smells terrible, the park can get badly waterlogged when it rains and we need a decent way of keeping the place clean and tidy. I for one would be perfectly happy to pick up rubbish if the tools to do so were in place, and the bins not constantly overflowing.

- My worry is more re the drug addicts who hang out besides the park. Security cameras would be welcome and prevention of vandalism and graffiti
- It would be good to move the infant area away from the corner where it is as junkies meet up right behind the fencing by the infant area
- I think the idea of a new "Compact" play area is completely wrong. Today kids are being robbed of their childhood, fun and games and everything it was to be a child. Both my kids use the ramp park along with the basket ball court and the kids play area. They love it all. I think robbing crucial square footage from the kids is unacceptable. This space can be used to maximise the area for kids usage. In my opinion the equipment needs to be updated with new an exciting equipment is a must and a re design of the ramp area may be good.
- My concerns are with the current nature reserve that is next to the park and the people it attracts, I've been at the park with my son when up to almost 20 people under the influence of alcohol and drugs stumbled out of the area during the day. It is a daily occurrence
- I do not think the play area should be reduced at all!! I think it should be extended if anything or another area set up with the existing play area size remaining!! To try and cut back from the children's play area is disgusting. Whom ever thought of it should be ashamed of themselves and those that agree with it too!!!

- New ideas of equipment and playground activities are great, but I do not agree for the part of play area to be reduced.
- bigger than what it is now
- I don't think that the play area should be reduced in size to make it compact. If anything, there's lots of space to create a spacious area. Especially since the teen area should be spaced away from the junior area. As a side note, the construction of the football club has caused havoc to the surrounding area. Rectory Park was a beatiful space before then. At least the Council should create solid walkways so that it's easy for parents and their children to safely walk to the play areas after it has rained or in the winter when the ground doesn't dry up quickly.
- As long as it's kept up to date and equipment fixed when broken and play area cleaned. It will
 probably attract teenagers who tend to vandalise things which then disappoints children when
 equipment is then broken.
- The design layout is fantastic. The new designated development location just by the skate area is something I've been thinking of for a while and hoping for. Along with with all the play area theme, I would suggest a small area anywhere near the new development to be granted to have a small artificial lake to emphasise the scenery theme of the park. Somewhere the

adults can sit and enjoy the beauty of the park with all the new apartments starting on rectory road all the way up to Gifford Primary School. Sat in the park 5am in the morning sunrise, the landscape view of the sky as you look towards the apartments and all over the park including the new football ground run by Middlesex FA, all the way round to the new apartments currently being built on Ruislip road just by Wayfarer Road/Estate closer to white hart roundabout; is absolutely sensational. There's obviously loads of lakes/ and scenery in the Northolt hills which i also visit often. However, it's a lot more inconvenient for me to go as far as the hills just to capture scenic vibe 5 in the morning while the park here itself has exceptionally beautiful scenery. These are my views. - Please do not make this park area small or compact. The grass areas of the current park
 layout are ideal for numerous children to run around safely in an enclosed area without
 getting in the way of others using the provided park facilities. With young children, myself and
 my partner favour this park, due to the above reason, over Northala with the recent child

Final comment, the access to the infant side of the play area the tarmacked extension of Parkfield Drive is very often flooded during and after medium to heavy rainfall. As part of this renovation could you please review this and put in extra drainage.

- I live right next to it and go there for walks and visit the playground on occasions

- s stated in my comments already the nature reserve area next to the park and the people it attracts, who sit in there drinking and taking drugs.
- If the weather is bad.
- It's very difficult to walk on the raw paths after wet weather especially in the winter as the ground doesn't dry up quickly. It's often too soggy. I like the tarmaced paths in the park adjacent to Rectory Park. I think that's called Northala Fields or something like that. It's much easier to walk there but I need to walk through Rectory Park in order to get there.
- 5 minute walk from our house. The play area is so disappointing when updated we will use it a few times a week.
- I actually visit the park every day. This wasn't a selective option in the answers. The highest answer was 'almost everyday '. Please be notified.
- i would take my sister children everyday to the park, put now they are some things which are broken or too old to be use. having new equipment will be great for everyone.
- Feel unsafe, I think making a teenage park will cause then to hang around there so I definitely wouldn't use it if gangs are hanging around there.
- i use the park daily as i have a dog however it is not a park i would opt to take my children to currently as there is SO MUCH crime, drug dealing/taking, dog owners who have no control of their dangerous animals. its lovely to see the cricket matches and families attempting to use the area however the litter is a disgrace and there are not enough bins, or seating areas for people picnic tables would be a great addition along with properly measured waste management.
- I have an 18month old but tend not to use this park as the flooring has lots of holes and there's not a lot for him to do. My 9 year old used to love the zip line but that has been removed. And there is a lot of damage to the general flooring.

Robust play equipment that is regularly checked.

- Some teen gangs are intimidating. Area looks shabby and run down, overgrown grass and rubbish left all over the place. The grass on the northala hills overgrown for months and looking rather sad. Ealing council something must de done about this! Shabby rundown areas attracts thugs and promotes unsafe activity.
- Unaccompanied older children can cause a worry.
- I'm always on edge when using the children's playground based on the drug dealing. I always actively encourage my children to only play for 5/10 minutes maximum so we can go over to the hills instead. To improve the area it would be great to expose the wooded area so that the drug dealers aren't able to deal there any more.
- Lighting, no park safety patrol
- Better lighting
- A lot of junkies around the bushes behind the play area so something would need to be done about this
- More park patrol police
- Trees near the children area have drug pedlars and drunk people
- As mentioned above, the hedges a d bushes around the play areas can be cut down below waist levels. More lighting can help. If possible, the play area can be moved forward closer to Ruislip Road.
- I've been visiting the park for over 20 years with my children and now my grandchildren, there seems to be slot of men just hanging around and sometimes begging which makes me feel vulnerable sometimes
- Safety around children and people under the influence of drugs makes me feel uneasy and puts me off taking my kids to this park.
- Lots of drunks hiding in the trees a few times I went
- Next to the kids play area, there is a jungle of trees where illegal activities like drug dealers & drugists coming to & fro takes place which everyone knows, so if this jungle of trees area can be improved & made it more open & visible then hopefully it can be more safe.
- AS SAID THE PARK END UP SPLIT, TO THE AREA, NORTH SOUTH EAST THE WEST IS UP AND COMMING. CHECK THE WINTER NIGHTS WITH THE POLICE RECORDS, CALLS

- The park is set out so that people either play at the back or use the FA grounds. There isn't much to do inbetween
- If a playground is kept nice and in good working condition It attracts better/manored people
- Drug and alcohol use in the conservation area.
- They should be barriers in between to segregate each area so that little children can't run too far away from parents
- There are a few local weirdos but they're harmless. Please don't use this as an excuse to vilify the locals. We don't want a gentrified little enclave here, we want useful public utilities that benefit everyone.
- Playground drug addicts
- As stated earlier either move the infant play area away or erect higher fencing which is bordering with the conservation area due to drug users regularly attending the place and doing their business right in front our eyes and our children. It doesn't feel safe
- above all I think safety and security needs to be addressed. I visit the play area and ramps with my kids about 3 times a week and EVERY single time I see teens and adults selling, buying and doing drugs in plain sight. There are no police around, no cameras and when reported to the council and police, nothing is ever done. When my kids ask why is that man/woman doing that and acting the way they are I have to say something along the lines of they are ill and taking their medication at which point I move my kids away from the area.
- The people that congregate in the nature reserve under the influence of drugs and alcohol
- Lighting along the path areas throughout the park and especially on the paths in the middle of the park to access the play area's
- There are some people dealing some stuff behind the playground which is scary sometimes.
- Redo the whole area
- Safety cameras and police controlling area on regular basis
- Adults without children should not be allowed in childrens play area. There should be better and clearer deterrents for this.
- sometime you would have people driving they scooter in the ground. and some people would bring they dogs into the play areas.

- Gangs of teenagers will hang out there , you see people won't take there children there all your going to do is create a teenagers hangout
- Its the way there which is where you go by young adults who tend to look threatening
- drug dealing in the "nature area"
- Gangs and drug takers (I mean hard drugs like crack)
- Don't feel safe due to drug and alcoholics using the park to sleep and do their business
