PROPOSAL THE EALING (PRESCRIBED ROUTES)

(NO. *) TRAFFIC ORDER 2022

THE EALING (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION)

(SPECIAL PARKING AREA) (AMENDMENT NO. *)

ORDER 2022

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the London Borough of Ealing propose, to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The general effect of the Prescribed Routes Order would be to
 - (a) pedestrianise Brownlow Road between its junction with Broadway West Ealing and the south-east side of the car park north-west of Freedom House, Brownlow Road by prohibiting motor vehicles in this length of the road. The above-mentioned prohibition would not apply to pedal cycles and to vehicles being used for ambulance, fire service or police purposes; and
 - (b) vary the one-way working in Brownlow Road so as to provide for contra flow working for pedal cyclists in Brownlow Road.
3. The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would be to vary the waiting restrictions in Brownlow Road so that they apply at any time.
