Foreword

Firstly, we would like to say a huge thank you to all those who took part in the Shaping Ealing survey. More than 10,600 residents, businesses and others who visit our borough took part in one of the biggest consultations we have carried out. We are delighted that so many of you took the opportunity to share what you think about our borough, about the seven different towns and the facilities and communities in each of these areas.

Ealing is changing. We know our task is to make sure it changes for the better. Right across the seven towns that make our borough special, we know that people care passionately about the future of their communities. Shaping Ealing was designed to capture that, and ensure that the hopes, aspirations, identity, and pride for our neighbourhoods is reflected in the plans we make to shape Ealing for the decade ahead.

We are committed to being open, transparent and inclusive in our approach, as we navigate the challenges we face in the years ahead, responding to the climate emergency, the economic recovery from Brexit and the pandemic, and build a better relationships with and within our communities.

Over 10,000 people participated through Shaping Ealing, in setting out and making clear the things that you know need to change for the better. Whether it is ensuring that good, well paid jobs can be accessed locally, that future generations have access to genuinely affordable homes, or that we preserve and protect the best bits of our built environment and open spaces that give our towns the identities and purpose that makes them what they are.

Having this feedback is important to us to help understand how people think and feel and it will help us develop plans and policies to guide future development and investment in each of Ealing's seven towns. Shaping Ealing – the approach

The Shaping Ealing engagement was carried out between November 2021 and May 2022. It consisted of a simple, easy to complete online survey open to all those who live in, work in or visit the borough. A wide-ranging programme of communications was run to engage as many people as possible and to obtain feedback from all of our communities. This resulted in 10,661 people taking part.

The survey consisted of a series of statements to explore levels of satisfaction with a range of themes plus a number of questions where people were able to type in and share more detailed views.

Additionally, a series of community events and conversations were held in various parts of the borough to reach out and engage with those who may not have taken part in the online survey.

The survey and communications materials were translated into the main community languages to provide an opportunity for all to take part.

Whilst the Shaping Ealing survey was not a random sample of people entirely representative of the borough's population, the size of the response does provide a good picture of what different people in all parts of the borough think and feel about the issues explored.

The Shaping Ealing survey was set up to help inform the development of the council's New Local Plan which you can find out more about here (insert link).








Views about the borough

Question 1 What is the one thing you like most about the area?







Chart 1 Where people live or spend their time



What people do here




Chart 3 **Ethnicity of respondents**



Age groups




Chart 6 **Survey response**




Chart 5 **Gender of respondents**






Chart 7 **People with disabilities**

Through the Shaping Ealing survey you have told us about the issues important to you and the things that you know need to change for the better.


