PROPOSAL TO INCLUDE ALDERNEY GARDENS, CHURCH AVENUE, HAREWOOD AVENUE, HAREWOOD CLOSE, LYTTON CLOSE AND MANOR AVENUE IN CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE NS

The Ealing (Northolt Station - Zone NS) (Residents Parking Places) (Amendment No. *) Order 2023

The Ealing (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Special Parking Area) (Amendment No. **) Order 2023

The Ealing (Parking Places) (Telephone Parking) (Northolt Station - Zone NS) Order 2023

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Ealing Council, in connection with the extension of the Northolt Station controlled parking zone NS to include Alderney Gardens, Church Avenue, Harewood Avenue, Harewood Close, Lytton Close and Manor Avenue, propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.
2. The general effect of the Residents Parking Places Order would be to:
 - (a) introduce parking places for the use of residents, their visitors and business users in lengths of Alderney Gardens, Church Avenue, Harewood Avenue, Harewood Close, Lytton Close and Manor Avenue
 - (b) provide that the parking places would operate between the hours of 9am and 10am and between 2pm and 3pm. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive; and
 - (c) provide that passenger vehicles, goods carrying vehicles, motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles may be left in a parking place without limitation on time during the controlled hours and provided that with the exception of motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles, a valid (in an electronic form) NS zone permit, or voucher has been issued to the vehicle;
3. The general effect of the Telephone Parking Order would be to:
 - (a) introduce "shared use permit holder /telephone" parking places operating between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in a length of;
 - (b) provide that passenger vehicles, goods carrying vehicles, motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles may be left in the parking places and that with the exception of motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles, a valid V zone permit must be held for the vehicle or payment made by mobile phone using the telephone payment parking system operated by Pay by Phone whilst parked in the parking place;
 - (c) provide that the charges for parking in the "shared use/telephone" parking places would be charged on an emissions basis and vary between 70p and £1.30 per hour up to a maximum charge of between £3.15 and £6.30 per day;
 - (d) Users of the telephone payment system should follow the instructions displayed in the parking place quoting the unique number relating to that parking place to the service provider and providing information as requested. Payment of the parking charge can then be made using most debit and credit cards. Text receipt for the parking session and expiry of parking reminder text messages are available free of charge.
4. The general effect of the Ealing (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Special Parking Area) (Amendment No. *) Order 202* would be to amend existing waiting restrictions or introduce new waiting restrictions that would apply "at any time", or between the controlled hours of 9am and 10am and between 2pm and 3pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in lengths of Alderney Gardens, Church Avenue, Harewood Avenue, Harewood Close, Lytton Close and Manor Avenue
5. Residents' Parking Permits (which are issued in an electronic form) would be charged as follows

A	Up to 100	Up to 1100cc	£45
B to E	101-140	1101cc to 1600cc	£71
F to I	141-185	1601cc to 1849cc	£97
J to M	186 and above	1850cc and above	£125

There would be a £30 discount for electric vehicles from the above charges, however there is a minimum charge of £20 for a permit.

Older diesel vehicles (manufactured in 2015 or before) would be subject to an additional charge of £50

6. Business Parking Permits would be available at a cost of £805.60 per annum.
7. Business Visitors Vouchers can be purchased at a cost of £2.40 per hour and Residents' Visitors Vouchers can be purchased at a cost of 80 pence per hour. These vouchers would be issued in an electronic form
