WAITING RESTRICTIONS IN WINDMILL LANE SOUTHALL

The Ealing (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Special Parking Area) (Amendment No. 887) Order 2023

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Ealing Council, to assist traffic flow and reduce congestion, on the 26th September 2023 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.
2. The general effect of the Order will be to impose waiting restrictions that they will apply at any time in the lengths of road described in the Schedule to this Notice. The restrictions on the east side formalise those in place.
3. The Order, which will come into operation on the 28th September 2023, other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order including a plans, are available by e-mail from trafficnotices@ealing.gov.uk or by inspection at Customer Services Reception, Perceval House, 14-16 Uxbridge Road W5 2HL between 9:00am and 4:45pm on Monday to Friday, until the 7th November 2023..
4. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any relevant requirements thereof or any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may make application for the purpose to the High Court by the 7th November 2023.

Windmill Lane, Southall

- (a) the north-east and east side, between its junction with Uxbridge Road, Southall and a point opposite the southern kerb-line of Armstrong Way;
- (b) the south-west and west side, between its junction with Uxbridge Road, Southall and a point 3 metres north of a point opposite the northern kerb-line of Windmill Avenue.
