1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 School Streets Schemes

- 1.1.1 The London Borough of Ealing (LBE) has implemented School Streets schemes at multiple schools across the Borough. These schemes involve the access limitations on streets immediately adjacent to schools during drop-off and pick-up times, and therefore the streets around school entrances become a pedestrian and cycle-only zone before and after school. A limited category of persons can gain exemption from these restrictions. Restrictions are enforced by a physical barrier and a volunteer to monitor it and allow access to exempt vehicles, or alternatively by ANPR cameras.
- 1.1.2 The aim of School Streets programme is to encourage children to travel to school via active modes, as well as reducing congestion, making the roads safer to cross and the environment more pleasant for the whole community. Under the COVID-19 emergency measures, they also allow for social distancing.
- 1.1.3 Twelve School Streets schemes have been implemented. The first of these was the LIP Funded scheme at Perivale Primary School / St John Fisher School (reported separately), with a further 11 implemented as part of the London Streetspace Programme (LSP) (reported separately). Eight further scheme are under consideration, and a pre-implementation survey has been undertake with stakeholders (this report).

1.2 Evaluation Approach

- 1.2.1 The following schools are considered in this report:
 - Christ the Saviour Primary School;
 - Grange Primary School;
 - O Horsenden Primary School;
 - Lady Margaret Primary School;
 - North Primary School;
 - St Gregorys Primary;
 - Viking Primary School; and
 - O St Josephs Catholic Primary School.
- 1.2.2 For each school, data from the following sources has been analysed:
 - STARS data;
 - Stakeholder Survey, comprising of closed and open response questions:
 - Parents/ carers;
 - Staff:
 - Pupils; and
 - Local residents/ business.
- 1.2.3 Survey analysis was carried out by SYSTRA Ltd, including analysis of open ended responses. Full data tables from open and closed questions are provided in the attached appendices.
- 1.2.4 Resident/ business responses were checked to ensure all responses came from postcodes within the school vicinity. The majority of postcodes were within close proximity of the

relevant school, with a small number coming from residents between 2.5-4 miles away, most of which stated they travelled though/ to the area regularly, so responses were retained. Those who did not provide a postcode were also retained in the data. No responses were excluded.

1.2.5 This report draws together the data sources to evaluate the level of support the proposed schemes have and identify if any major issues are likely to arise as a result of their implementation.

2. OVERVIEW

2.1 Introduction

2.1.1 This section summarises the key data collected from the schools, to provide an overview of the results and benchmarking between schools.

2.2 Survey Data

2.2.1 The table below summarises the volume of responses to each of parent/ carer, resident/ business and staff online surveys. However, it should be noted that only Christ the Saviour Primary School had responses from businesses; all the others were residents only.

2.3 Current Mode of Travel

2.3.1 As shown below, current mode of travel reported by parents/ carers varied; at almost all schools, walking accounted for the highest mode share. However, at Lady Margaret Primary School, 75% of those who responded travelled by car (a small response base, 8, should be noted – and it should also be considered that those likely to be more impacted by the scheme would be more motivated to respond). Horsenden Primary also had a higher car mode share; 37% - indicating parents/ carers at these two school might be more impacted than at other schools. For the remaining schools, between 14% and 28% reporting travelling by car.

2.3.2 For the majority of residents responding to the survey, car was their usual mode of travel. Only residents responding regarding Grange Primary School has a higher mode shade of active travel than car use. Residents responding in relation to Viking School had a particularly high mode share for car reported; 80%.

2.3.3 Staff travel also showed a mixed picture, possibly partly attributed to low response rates at some schools. Of the schools from which staff responded, at least a third travelled by car.

2.3.4 Amongst pupils that responded, St Josephs' Catholic Primary School reported the highest use of active travel modes (74%), followed by North Primary School (61%). Horsenden Primary had the highest car mode share (42%, in line with the parent/ carer responses) with others between 19% and 33%.

2.4 Agreement with Aims

2.4.1 The table below summarises parent/ carer views of the aims of the scheme. Across all schools, and all aims, a high proportion of respondents rated the aims as at least 'slightly important'. There was a similar trend with residents, and staff tended to be even more strongly in agreement with the aims.

2.5 Agreement with Statements

2.5.1 On average, parents/ carers were mostly strongly in agreement with 'Road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and' Congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved'. Horsenden School and Viking School parents/ carers were particularly in agreement regarding congestion, and these two schools also had high agreements that 'Cars are travelling at high speeds in the local area'. At all schools, the majority agree that 'there are parking and congestion issues related to the school'.

2.5.4 Pupils were asked a series of different statements regarding their school travel. On average, just over half (53%) disagreed 'It isn't easy to walk, scoot or cycle' (as such implying it is easy to walk, scoot or cycle). On average, 42% agree that 'I see lots of children walking, scooting or cycling to school'. A third disagreed 'We can hear each other clearly when we chat on our way to school' and a third agreed they could smell car fumes.

2.6 Support for Schemes

2.6.1 Respondents were asked if they agree with the scheme overall, whilst social distancing was still in place, and as a permanent measure. There was minor variation in response to each of these, with a general feel that just over half of parents/ carers were in favour of the scheme, around three-quarters of school staff and just under half of residents/ businesses.

3. SCHOOL SUMMARIES

3.1 Christ the Saviour Primary School

Scheme Overview

- 3.1.1 Christ the Saviour is a Bronze STARS accredited school. The Infant school is situation at the back of a large shopping centre. There is a modal filter on the school boundary which means that parents who drive do u-turns directly outside the school gates at pick up and drop off times. This causes congestion and safety issues for families travelling with little children. The road is quite long with a CPZ that extends from 8.30am-7.30pm. There are a few shop and stop bays outside the small row of shops midway along The Grove. The lack of available parking does not deter parents from driving.
- 3.1.2 This is a faith school and as such has families travelling a longer distance to get to school, which may impact on numbers who drive, however, there are excellent public transport links very near to the school.
- 3.1.3 From September 2021, it is planned that The Grove will be closed during restrictions (Infant and Nursery School site), with a barrier in place on Windsor Road. The closure will impact 285 properties which includes 11 shops/businesses. The barrier will be manned by staff or volunteers 8:15 9:15am and 2:45 3.45pm.

Survey Results

- 3.1.4 Parents/ carers (169 responses) already report a good level of use of active modes (56% walking or cycling to school; compared to 54% on average across the school). Car travel accounted for 28% of responses. At least 80% are in favour of each of the aims.
- 3.1.5 Of the statements presented, the ones with the highest level of agreement were 'Road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' (66% agree or strongly agree) and 'I see lots of children walking and cycling' (73%). Further to this, 64% agree 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved'. Only around 1 in 10 are in disagreement with each of these.
 - "Air quality and safety is a huge, huge concern for parents of Christ The Saviour school children. It is so worrying how congested and polluted the area is."
- 3.1.6 59% agree that there are parking and congestion issues related to the school, and only 21% think that the School Street will be disruptive and inconvenient.
- 3.1.7 In 'further comments', 24 positive comments were provided by parents/ carers, 10 expressing general support, and 9 expressing a need for the scheme for safety:
 - "A school street at the Grove would be a fantastic improvement to the safety of children arriving/leaving school. Parked cars with idling engines blocking the roads and access for cycles and cargo bikes has become a real problem"
 - "I think this is an excellent idea, I am constantly fearful of cars rushing past whilst trying to walk the children to school with many drivers simply oblivious to those around them and the risk of children in the vicinity. I would feel much more comfortable if the road was safer and may even encourage the children to cycle in to school also"
- 3.1.8 19 opposing comments were also made, 7 expressing general opposition and 3 feeling it will create difficulties for those travelling from further away:

"The school has no catchment rules so many including myself travel from other boroughs. It is not fair to ignore that it would affect many like myself who have no choice but to travel by car."

3.1.9 Others made suggestions or highlighted particular problem areas:

"We should also have signs asking cars to turn off their engines while waiting at the traffic lights"

"you need to tackle the people from CtS and BusyBees nursery who park next to the metal barrier (on the other side from the school)"

"The Grove should be a one-way street, leading from Windsor Road to B445. This would allow a much better flow of traffic on the road without the need for people to make U-turns or drive backward"

"The car parks must give enough available spaces to parents to provide safe parking ie no closing of floors or allocation to council parking only, so that parents can legally pay and walk their children into school."

- 3.1.10 Overall, 21% of parents/ carers oppose the scheme, 64% support the scheme (50% 'strongly support'), and 16% are neutral.
- 3.1.11 Of residents/ businesses (42 respondents, of which 6 were businesses within the area), a third reported usually using active modes, and 38% using the car. There was a lower level of agreement with the aims that parents/ carers showed; only 55% agreed with the aim of 'Providing space for social distancing at school drop off and pick up times', but at least 60% were in agreement with the other aims. Likewise, they showed a slightly lower level of support for the statements about the scheme, with 50% and 57% agreeing that road safety, and congestion, needs to be improved; around quarter disagree with these. Despite this, 62% do agree 'There are parking and congestion issues related to the school'. 43% feel the School Street will be disruptive and inconvenient. 50% agree that drivers leave their engines running when they are parked; the highest of any school.
- 3.1.12 In further comments, business respondents were concerned about the impact:

"I feel that for local business affected (mine included) – completely blocking off the road between 8.15 - 9.15am is incredibly hindering to local business."

"Closing access to this property at the times proposed will potentially devastate my business and lose local businesses. All my customers need access at all times to either access their offices at the start of the day while car parkers renting spaces arrive and leave throughout the day."

3.1.13 Residents had similar concerns in comments to parents/ carers, as well as concerns about access to their properties:

"I would like delivery drivers and workmen still to be able to drive to my house during the restrictions. In general, the scheme sounds a good idea in theory as we do get a lot of parents of CtS parking down our street making it very difficult to find a parking space at times."

- 3.1.14 Overall, 52% residents/ businesses support the scheme (38% 'strongly') and just over a third (38%) oppose the scheme, with 1 in 10 remaining neutral.
- **3.1.15** Staff (37 responses) are positive about all aspects of the scheme, including the aims and statements around the scheme. Around 9 in 10 staff who responded agreed road safety and congestion needed improving. However, a quarter agreed that the School Street will be 'disruptive and inconvenient'. **Overall, 93% of staff were in favour of the scheme.**
- 3.1.16 54% of pupils who responded (83) stated they already walk, cycle or scoot to school. Almost all agreed with the aims. 30% agree that it isn't easy to walk, cycle or scoot to school, and 22% do not agree that they can cross the road outside their school safely. A third agree they can smell car fumes.

STARS Data

3.1.17 STARS data from 2019 shows a similar pattern of travel mode to what was reported in the School Street Survey.

- Parents/ carers and staff offer the highest levels of support for the scheme;
- Although 33% of residents strongly oppose the scheme, a higher proportion are strongly in support (38%);
- Road safety, followed by congestion, appear to be the issues that most need addressing; and
- Ensure businesses in the scheme area are kept informed.

3.2 Grange Primary School

Scheme Overview

- 3.2.1 The school has issues with inconsiderate parent parking in Church Gardens for many years. The road is no-through with very limited available parking and CPZ from 10am 7.30pm. Cars are parked on both sides of the road leaving sufficient width for a single car. Cars complete uturns at the end, or reverse back up the road: a safety risk to those walking or cycling. Both the council and school have received complaints about verbal altercations on the morning and afternoon school runs.
- 3.2.2 This scheme was due to start in 2020 but due to lack of engagement from parents it did not progress at that time. Some signage is already installed.
- 3.2.3 The proposed closure during restrictions will cover Church Gardens and Church Place. There is a council run car park that exits onto Church Gardens so the scheme needs two barriers to prevent people cutting through the car park into Church Gardens.
- 3.2.4 The closure will impact 100 residential properties. The barrier will be manned by staff or volunteers 8:15 9:15am and 2:45 3.45pm.

- 3.2.5 A low response rate was obtained from parents/ carers (14 responses). Of these, 86% reported using active modes to school, with 14% travelling to school by car. At least 70% agreed with each of the aims.
- 3.2.6 64% of parents/ carers were in agreement that road safety needs improving, and 50% that congestions around the school needs improving. 20% disagree with these. Around half (43%) agree there are parking and congestion issues related to the school, but 21% disagree and a third responded neutrally. Half were unsure if the School Street would be inconvenient and disruptive, but 28% felt it would be. In comments, some raised concerns:

"There has never been any accidents on this street, it's a quiet street with a dead end so drivers are aware of how to drive down the street, it's not possible to exceed speeds and be reckless, unlike other schools situated near busy roads. Why are you trying to fix something that's not broken?"

3.2.7 And some parents/ carers made suggestions:

"Consider including the section of Olive Road north of its junction with Maple Grove and Sunderland Road. Many children have to cross Olive Road here, headed for the footbridge over the Piccadilly Line."

- 3.2.8 Overall, the vast majority of parents/ carers (71%) were in support of the scheme, with 14% in opposition and 14% neutral/ unsure.
- 3.2.9 18 residents responded to the survey. Of these, two-thirds already usually use active modes, the highest of any school in this report. More residents were in agreement that congestion needed improving (55%) than road safety (39%). Exactly half agree there are congestion and parking issues related to the school, but 56% agree the School Street will be disruptive and inconvenient. Further comments included suggestions on this:

"If local residents who are outside the scheme but who pay for parking rights within the zone are included to give them free access to their vehicles, then I can see how this one could work."

"Traffic wardens to discourage parents parking in the W54JEJE area that will be inundated after this school road goes in. Or a barrier this side too of the railway bridge stopping people accessing Olive Rd"

"...perhaps leave spaces for the very near car park (free) for those who for one reason or another need a car to transport their children to school"

"If people park around the Church Lane area we really feel there need to be safer crossings by the mini roundabout - where the apple tree corner shop is"

"I am very concerned re Ranelagh Road, as due to the traffic calming in place around Ealing and the road closed already, Ranelagh Road has become much much busier"

3.2.10 Other comments (2 respondents) highlighted difficulties Church Garden residents have in accessing their road and parking at pick-up drop-off times. Another highlighted a concern that "parents will still be able to drive to the school via the car park" and that those leaving Church Gardens or the car park would be "stranded".

- 3.2.11 A third support the scheme, and half oppose the scheme. The highest proportion 'strongly oppose' to the scheme (33%).
- 3.2.12 Staff tended to be more reliant on the car than other stakeholder groups (two-thirds of the 12 respondents) but had high support for the aims.
 - "It would be lovely to move towards a safer, calmer and more environmentally friendly school environment for all"
- 3.2.13 Nearly all agreed congestion and road safety needed improving. 75% agree they already see lots of children walking and cycling, and 75% also agree there are parking and congestion issues related to the school. One staff member commented:
 - "Timings of the street will be an issue in the morning as staff have different start times, and there is a phased start for different year groups"
- 3.2.14 Overall, 84% of staff support the scheme, with 16% remaining neutral.
- 3.2.15 No pupils responded to this survey.

Key Findings and Recommendations

- There is a high use of active modes in the school and wider community;
- Parents/ carers felt road safety was more of a priority than congestion for improvement, though both had a high level of agreement; residents were more in agreement with improving congestion than road safety;
- Ensure residents are properly informed of permit system for access, and of the nature of the restriction (type of barrier);
- Ensuring staff are informed of the timings; and
- The largest proportion of parents/ carers were strongly in support, whereas the highest proportion of residents were strongly opposed.

3.3 Horsenden Primary School

Scheme Overview

- 3.3.1 Horsenden is a four-form entry school with two entrances Horsenden Lane and Elton Avenue. There are many dropped kerbs in this area making legal parking spaces a premium.
- 3.3.2 The closure will impact 100 residential properties. The barrier will be manned by staff or volunteers between 8:30 9:15am and 2:45 3.30pm.
- 3.3.3 The School Street scheme is at the back entrance to the school for two year groups.

- 3.3.4 19 parents/ carers responded to the survey. Of these, two-thirds already walk to school. Nearly all agreed with the aims of the scheme.
- 3.3.5 Two-thirds of parents/ carers agree that 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and a similar proportion 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved' (64%); slightly above the average of 60%/ 55% across all schools. 79% agree 'there are lots of cars travelling to the area' (compared to an average of 56%) and 68% agree cars are travelling at high speeds. Overall, over half (58%) support the scheme (47% 'strongly support'), with 21% in opposition (16% 'strongly oppose'). 1 in 5 responded neutrally. Some parents in comments recognised difficulties regarding current arrangements:

"I can definitely say that there are irresponsible parents/ carers who park in front of residents driveways and right at the school gates which causes traffic."

"It is extremely important to me to allow us to walk and cycle without being subject to so much air pollution which affects our asthma"

Others noted concerns about the scheme:

"By making these changes you take away choice. We have children with disabilities, no local transport going close to the school, different pick up and drop off times for children. Working parents who Struggle to get to work as it is. Restricting parking during school times will only make things harder for local residents and parents."

Other parents/ carers made suggestions or raised concerns, with two suggesting a one-way system:

"Horsenden Lane North and Elton AVE get extremely congested during the school runs. I personally think that the council needs to consider a one way system."

"Another couple of pedestrian crossing would be beneficial. One on Elton Ave, near school gates and the other at the end of Elton Ave, near Horsenden Lane North (or some traffic calming measure here)"

"Concerned about increased issues on Berkeley Av and Horsenden Lane North"

- 3.3.6 56% of residents responding to the survey (27 in total) usually travel by car in the area. Around half agree that both congestion, and road safety in the area, needs improving. 62% agree there are parking and congestion issues related to the school, with only 12% disagreeing with this. Nearly half (43%) agree that the School Street will be inconvenient and disruptive. 41% of residents were in support of the scheme (30% 'strongly') compared to a similar proportion opposed to the scheme (37% of which 30% 'strongly oppose).
- 3.3.7 Comments from residents included concerns about access and impact on surrounding roads:

"As a resident within the proposed area I would need assurance that I will not be 'trapped' within the barriers and will have access through them.... I am in favour of the proposed plan and look forward to seeing more parents and children walking to school in September."

"I think the council should work with schools to ensure staggered drop-off and pick-ups remain something that stays as it has already helped hugely with traffic and foot traffic in the surrounding area."

"School needs to encourage parents to park in the car park by Berkley Fields and walk ."

"If this scheme is being put into place in Elton Avenue it also needs to be put in place for Horsenden Lane North"

3.3.8 Staff members (16 respondents) had a high reliance on car travel (56%). However, 100% of respondents were in agreement with each aim. 81% agreed 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved', and 81% agreed 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved'. A quarter felt the scheme would be disruptive and inconvenient, but the largest proportion (50%) responded neutrally to this. Overall, two-thirds supported the scheme (44% 'strongly support') and just 6% oppose the scheme, with the remaining third being neutral in their response.

"It would be good if parents could get a reward for walking to school with their children."

3.3.9 Over half of pupils who responded to the survey (26 in total) reported usually travelling by foot, cycle or scooter, with a third travelling by car. Just 15% agreed that 'it isn't easy to walk, scoot or cycle', and 73% agree that 'I am able to cross the road outside my school safely', suggesting children do not perceive road safety issues.

3.3.10 The STARS data provided for 2020/21 is similar to the mode shares reported in the School Streets survey.

- Parents agree there are road safety issues; that it needs improving, that there is a high volume of cars and that cars are travelling at fast speeds;
- Consider ways to encourage/ incentive parking at Berkley Fields to lessen impact on surrounding roads (particular consideration to Horsenden Lane North); and
- Residents showed a mixed level of support.

3.4 Lady Margaret Primary School

Scheme Overview

- 3.4.1 Lady Margaret Primary School submitted an expression of interest for the School Street due to its location and issues with poor, unsafe and illegal parking on roads around the school. The school is located in a heavily populated area of Southall. There school has more than one entrance: Lady Margaret Road, a busy road connecting Southall with the A40, Cornwall Avenue and Windermere Road.
- 3.4.2 The scheme would consist of two barriers on Cornwall Avenue, closing it from Lady Margaret Road to Ascot Gardens.
- 3.4.3 The School Travel team had concerns about the displacement of parking from Cornwall Avenue and were worried about the additional congestion along Windermere Road, which is already congested and has issues with poor, unsafe and illegal parking. We received an email from one of the Southall Councillor's, who lives across from the Windermere entrance, stating her concerns: that existing issues with parking are already significant, including driving on footpaths.
- 3.4.4 The school pulled out of the scheme on 20th May 2021.

3.4.5 8 parents/ carers responded to the survey; of which 75% stated they usually travel by car to school, with 25% walking (the lowest share of active modes across the schools, but may be impacted by response rate). Parents/ carers gave a mixed response to the statements about the scheme; 50% agreed that road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved; whereas 38% strongly disagree. Similarly, 38% strongly agree that 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved' compared to 50% that 'strongly disagree' – suggesting parents/ carers do not perceive there to be congestion or road safety issues.

Despite this, 50% agree there are lots of cars travelling to the area and that there is a lot of traffic noise. Half agree there are parking and congestion issues related to the school, and a third disagree. As a result, 63% of parents/ carers strongly oppose the scheme, compared to 38% that strongly support the scheme.

"I understand the reasons behind but do not feel this will work well in fact I believe it will have more of a negative impact result is congestion on other roads and parents having to arrive earlier and spend more time around the school"

- 3.4.6 Resident respondents (21) showed a differing pattern of responses to parents/ carers, with only 5% disagreeing that 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and no respondents disagreed that congestion needs improving. 72% agree there are parking and congestion issues related to the school. 45% agree the School Street will be disruptive and inconvenient (compared to half of parent/ carers).
- 3.4.7 As with other locations, local residents had concerns about being blocked within the closure areas when the barrier is up. Others highlighted a need for wider travel improvements, such as segregated cycle lanes on Lady Margaret Road, and one raised a concern about additional traffic on Windermere Road, or made other suggestions:

"If this scheme does not work then resident parking, like all other schools in the area would be a great idea"

"Dangerous rat running occurs from Allenby Road via Towers Road (which is very narrow). Closing off Towers Road to traffic in the peak times will make for a much better walking and cycling environment."

- 3.4.8 Overall, 48% of residents are supportive of the scheme, compared to 29% opposed to it.
- 3.4.9 No pupils responded to the survey, and one staff member responded.

"There definitely needs to be something in place, drivers are so reckless at drop off and pick up times, so rude and some become quite abusive. Even a volunteer police presence would be appreciated"

Key Findings and Recommendations

- Not all parents/ carers perceive there to be road safety issues or congestion issues that need addressing; however nearly all resident respondents agree these issues need addressing; and
- O Data suggests high car mode share amongst parents.
- 3.4.10 Residents are more supportive of the scheme than parents/ carers.

3.5 North Primary School

Scheme Overview

- 3.5.1 North Primary is a newly engaged school who will achieve Bronze accreditation this academic year (2020/21). The school are in a densely populated area just north of a busy retail area on the High Street in Southall.
- 3.5.2 The School Street Scheme will encompass a wide area with only one of the barriers within the sight line of the school gate. This makes the scheme more complex to deliver with three barriers. One of the roads closed to through traffic is particularly narrow so removing through traffic will make it safer for non-motorised road users.
- 3.5.3 The school has very high numbers of pupils who live within one mile of the school so active travel is a realistic option for the school run.
- 3.5.4 The closure will impact 107 residential properties. The barrier will be manned by staff or volunteers between 8:30 9:00am and 2:45 3.30pm.

3.5.5 Of the 31 parents/ carers that responded, 61% reported usually using active modes to school. An above average proportion were in agreement with the aims. 61% and 65% were in agreement with 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved' respectively. 42% agreed there are parking and congestion issues related to the school, but 50% agreed the School Street would be inconvenient and disruptive. Parents expressed some positive feedback:

"It is extremely chaotic at pick up time especially. I'm concerned someone will be run over by a car if it is not better controlled. So for this reason I have put that a calm atmosphere is extremely important"

"Fully support the School Street idea for all primary schools. It's about health and wellbeing of our children and we all know how pollution affects the lungs of little ones"

3.5.6 In further comments, some raised concerns and made suggestions:

"I feel the street could benefit from a 20mph sign throughout North Road to remind people to reduce their speed."

- 3.5.7 Overall, 61% of parents/ carers were in support (45% 'strongly') with 19% opposed ('strongly').
- 3.5.8 10 resident responses were received. At least 80% were in agreement with each of the aims, and 60% and 70% were in agreement with 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved' respectively. None disagreed that 'there are parking and congestion issues related to the school'. 60% agree that drivers leave their engines running when they are parked.

"The congestion at drop off and pick up is extremely worrying due to the immense danger it poses to children walking amongst the streets, it is a fantastic idea to reduce pollution in London."

- 3.5.9 Two residents felt strongly the issues of anti-social behaviour in the area (people drinking alcohol on the Green) should be more of a priority.
- 3.5.10 In total, 60% supported the scheme (all 'strongly') with 20% opposed and 20% remaining neutral.
- 3.5.11 No staff responded to the survey.
- 3.5.12 A total of 107 pupils responded to the survey. 68% stated they walk or cycle to school, with 26% travelling by car, mirroring parent/ carer responses. Almost all pupils agreed with the aims. 35% agree 'It isn't easy to walk, scoot or cycle', and 31% agree they can smell car fumes; although 64% agree 'I am able to cross the road outside my school safely'.

- Residents and parents/ carers had a similar level of agreement that 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved';
- The highest proportion of both stakeholder groups were strongly supportive of the scheme; and

3.6.1 The proposed scheme barrier is located at the entrance to Westlandmore Place.




Figure 6. Barrier Location: St Gregory Primary School

Survey Results

- 3.6.2 Survey data for this school was limited, with only 5 resident responses; as such, limited value can be put on the data. Of that that did response, 60% agreed 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and that 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved'. 60% also agreed that there are parking and congestion issues related to the school. Of that 5 that did response, 100% were opposed to the scheme.
- 3.6.3 Residents raised concerns about the impact on access to Westlandmore Place (access arrangements during closure) and impact on Park Gate (displaced parking). One highlighted noise pollution as a desired aim for the scheme. Open comments gave mixed views on the current parking situation, with one highlighting problems with illegal parking and one feeling there are no current issues.

"There are no parking issues in Westmoreland Place, parents do not drive in the close or park in front of residential houses. For above reasons imposing school street scheme on a tiny close like Westmoreland Place is absolutely unnecessary and it will make absolutely no difference in the transport mode of pupils of St Gregory school"

"Parents come down to the close often double parking when they are late to take their children into school."

"We feel that our car movement will be monitored and it is very 'big brother' like. Why should we have this just because we live near a school. More parking attendants should just be employed to issue tickets regularly."

3.7 St Joseph's Catholic Primary School

Scheme Overview

- 3.7.1 St Joseph's is a bronze accredited STARS school.
- 3.7.2 St Joseph's has 83% living within one mile making active travel a realistic option for most. This is unusually high for a faith school. The school does continue to have high numbers of pupils driven to school. As the area is mainly residential (there is a station nearby) this puts additional pressure on parking in the area.
- 3.7.3 The school has 7 entrances along York Avenue, which will spread the parking over a wider area. Car drive down York Avenue, but as it is a no through road, u-turn to exit the road causing a road safety risk.
- 3.7.4 The barriers will be operational between 8:30 9:00am and 2:45 3.30pm, manned by staff/ volunteers. 77 residential properties are within the closure area.

Survey Results

- 3.7.5 In total, 56 parent/ carers responded to the survey. Of these, 73% stated they walk to school (the highest mode share of any school reported), with 21% usually using the car. Almost all agreed with the aims, in particular 96% agreed with 'providing a more pleasant and calm atmosphere at school pick up and drop off' and 96% agreed 'making it safer to cross the road on foot', the highest proportion of any school.
- 3.7.6 82% agreed that 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved', higher than the average of 60% across all schools, and 71% agreed with improving congestion. 27% felt the scheme would be disruptive and inconvenient, but 50% did not. 73% agreed that 'there are parking and congestion issues related to the school'; the highest of any school demonstrating

that parents/ carers seem to feel there is a need for the scheme. As such, 66% strongly support the scheme, and a further 11% support it. 5% oppose the scheme.

A number of open comments highlighted current concerns with York Avenue and welcomed the proposals, with 9 people expressing that the scheme was needed for safety reasons:

"York Avenue during school drop off and pick up is very congested, I am glad something is finally been done to stop people dropping their children off on their road by car. As the road is a dead end it is particularly dangerous to pedestrians as not only are cars coming towards you but also reversing towards you. Some days you just don't know where to look."

3.7.7 Other parents/ carers raised concerns or made suggestions:

"I suggest an agreement with Lidl & nearby churches to allow parking at school start/ end times"

"The path leading to the zebra crossing on station road adjoining York road to access school on foot is dangerously overgrown with vegetation from the railway embankment."

"Extremely simple process for applying for any residents permits or visitors permits please!"

3.7.8 There were 47 responses from residents. The majority (55% and 77%) agreed that road safety, and congestion, in surrounding streets needs to be improved. 70% agree 'there are parking and congestion issues related to the school'. 40% agree the School Street will be disruptive, and 32% disagreed with this. Overall, 40% support the scheme (28% 'strongly') and 53% oppose the scheme (49% 'strongly').

"These changes are long overdue. There is constant abuse of parking regulations and I have had parents cars blocking my driveway and even parking ON my private driveway, believing it to be "their right" in order to drop their child off at school! It's pointless challenging them as they only get abusive "

3.7.9 Other open comments raised a number of concerns and suggestions, with 3 wanting existing restrictions better enforced, particularly those just outside the scheme area:

"Simply enforce the parking restrictions we already have - a simple and cost effective solution"

"What consideration has been given to delivery and trade vehicles, visiting NHS/ medical staff, residents' visitors etc?"

"Access to/ from Halford Place has not been considered. Use of Balfour Rd is essential to avoid increasing the Cherington Rd "car park". Suggest removing No Left Turn at junction with Uxbridge Rd or move the barrier so Balfour Rd is not within the boundary."

"Extend the school street to the end of York Avenue and also from top of Balfour Avenue leading into York Avenue."

3.7.10 Balfour Avenue was mentioned in a number of residents as an area of concern regarding displaced parking:

"While we are always supportive of helping our neighbouring streets with their traffic/ parking woes, we believe your proposal will singularly inconvenience the residents of Balfour Avenue

in terms of our regular movements and an already stretched parking situation. Also, the current parking situation means that we as residents of Balfour Avenue have to regularly park on the streets marked blue in your proposal. The proposed experiment will exclude us from parking on the "blue" streets, when necessary, further inconveniencing the residents"

"Could there be a one way system from York Avenue to Station Road to Station Approach or to Golden Manor?"

3.7.11 15 members of staff responded to the survey, of who nearly all agreed with the aims of the scheme. A notable 93% agreed that road safety on the surrounding streets needs improving, and 93% agree that 'there are lots of cars travelling in the local area'. 80% agree that 'there are parking and congestion issues related to the school'. 87% support the scheme (53% 'strongly'), with the remaining 13% being neutral.

Mirroring the parent/ carer responses, pupils (113 responses) mirrored the responses on mode choice, with 74% using sustainable modes. However, 61% agree 'I see lots of children arriving at school by car'. 1 in 10 disagreed that 'I am able to cross the road outside my school safely' and 70% agreed 'there are lots of cars outside my school'.

3.7.12 STARS data for pupils and staff is shown below. However, due to differing response bases between survey years, it is unclear if the whole school population has been included, and as such would recommend considering mode shift results with caution.

3.8 Viking Primary School

Scheme Overview

3.8.1 Viking Primary School is in a part of Northolt with poor transport links compared to other parts of Ealing. There are 90% of pupils living within one mile of the school making active travel a realistic option for the school run. However, the school has high numbers of parents who drive. There has been limited engagement with the school over the last two years and while the Head teacher is keen for the scheme to go ahead, she has concerns about the lack of parent engagement in the scheme. Volunteer stewards are the only way the school can make the scheme work.

Survey Results

- 3.8.2 16 parents/ carers responded to the survey. Of these, 69% reported usually travelling by foot to school, with a quarter stating 'car' as their usual mode. Of those that did response, 81% and 75% agreed 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and that 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved' respectively. 81% also agreed that there are lots of cars travelling in the local area (higher than the 56% average across all schools), and 81% agreed that drivers leave their engines running (40% on average) this was also mentioned in two open response comments. Overall, 69% of parents/ carers support the scheme (50% 'strongly') with 13% who 'tend to oppose' and 19% neutral.
- 3.8.3 The 5 resident respondents had similar feedback, with 80% agreeing both agreed 'road safety on surrounding streets needs to be improved' and that 'congestion on the surrounding streets needs to be improved'. 80% agree that there are parking and congestion issues related to the school. In comments, two highlighted a preference for camera enforcement. Some highlighted concerns about displaced traffic and parking:

"I think Canberra drive needs to be taken into consideration, this is aimed for Radcliffe way but now all the cars will come down Canberra drive causing more disruption"

"This road is frequently used as a through road from A312 to the Yeading lane which causes considerable congestion and dangerous traffic for pedestrians"

- 3.8.4 In total, 80% of residents support the scheme (60% 'strongly') and 20% responded neutrally.
- 3.8.5 Only two staff members responded to the survey, but both strongly agreed that road safety and congestion needed improving. **Both supported the scheme (100%).**

4. **CONCLUSIONS**

4.1 Overview

- 4.1.1 In open response comments, a number of residents highlighted concerns about being 'trapped' in or out of their streets during the closure, suggesting residents need to be well informed about the nature of the closure (type of barrier), timings, and access/ permit arrangements.
- 4.1.2 Some schools had a low response rate from stakeholders, and as such, in some instances firm conclusions cannot be drawn and further monitoring, and/ or observations, is recommended.
- 4.1.3 Parents/ carers were generally supportive, although at Lady Margaret Primary School (8 respondents) the majority were in opposition to the scheme; this school appears to have a particularly high mode share of car use and as such is likely to have a greater impact on parents than at schools with a higher share of active modes.
- 4.1.4 Although only mentioned on a few occasions, this issue of children becoming complacent about road safety should be considered at an early stage, ensuring schools are offered the tools for ongoing road safety education.
