Please only use the bin with the orange lid to dispose of items that can be recycled.

All your recyclable items can be mixed together in the bin. Please make sure you put the right things in the right bin.

Empty and **rinse** all containers before putting them into the bin.

Remove film lids from plastic pots, tubs and trays and put them in the rubbish bin.

Do not use black sacks. However, you can keep your recycling in a plastic carrier bag and put the whole bag into the recycling bin
