

Frequently asked questions

How do CPZs work?

A CPZ is an area where on-street parking is controlled and parking is prioritised for residents, businesses and their visitors. Signage on the street will tell you when the controls are in operation and who is able to park during the restricted times. Existing stop and shop bays will remain in place. Additional stop and shop bays are proposed near existing businesses to encourage customer turnover. These can be seen on the detailed maps online.

How much will it cost to park in a CPZ?

The basic cost of an annual resident parking permit is shown in the table below, and a business parking permit is £850. For the most up to date charges for resident, business, and visitor parking permits, visit the Ealing Council parking webpage.

Band	Price	Share of vehicles in each band (2023/24)
Emissions band 1 (0-100g of CO2 emitted per km)	£53	15%
Emissions band 2 101g-140g of CO2 emitted per km	£86	45%
Emissions band 3 141g-185g of CO2 emitted per km	£139	29%
Emissions band 4 186+ grams of CO2 emitted per km	£225	11%

What about visitor parking?

Resident permit holders can book a parking session for their visitors via the PayByPhone system. The parking information is stored electronically so there is no need to display a paper voucher in the vehicle. Users are only charged during the hours the CPZ operates. An hourly resident visitor permit costs £1.00 and a daily resident visitor permit costs £6.00.

I am a Blue Badge holder – how will this impact me?

Blue Badge holders can park for free in resident permit holder bays and shared-use permit holder bays with a Blue Badge on display. We also offer a free resident parking permit to Blue Badge holders who reside within Ealing.

I am/have a Carer – how will this impact me?

There are two types of carers' permits. Professional, for those who visit multiple people at various locations and Personal, for those visiting one individual at a specific location. The annual cost of each permit is £10.

How does the Council decide whether a CPZ is introduced?

The Council's decision to implement a CPZ is based on a combination of factors including feedback from residents and businesses responding to the survey, road

safety and traffic flow and the environmental and air quality impact of parking and traffic.
