What are we trying to solve?

We need to make sure our services are where they need to be, spread fairly across the borough and where there are gaps.

We want to decrease demand for services at the point of crisis and engage with more children and families when they first need our help and support.

We want to make sure our services for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) are local and personalised to families.

We want to use our assets as effectively as possible.

We want to create...

A more flexible and responsive service – we want to better reach communities by moving services to different sites or creating a service that is really personalised to each town.

A refreshed Children's Centre network – a network of services at different community sites, using a mixture of venues from schools and community centres to youth hubs and nurseries.

Improved services for the whole family at the earliest opportunity.

Services that are shaped and owned by the people that use them – we want communities to have more say in where services are delivered.

Proposal

Proposal is focused on a collaborative, community, and partnership approach to accessing universal and early help services to enhance and maximise outcomes for all of Ealing's communities.

Includes a strong and well-developed focus on service access for communities who may have been previously underserved

We want to make best use of our assets and broaden our reach into communities

We already use community sites for delivery but there is opportunity to do more.

Some of our centres could be used to meet the shortfall in childcare places, or to increase connections with the voluntary sector or a whole host of reasons.

Consultation will be detailed, inclusive and rigorous to ensure the fullest gathering of feedback, views and ideas from across the Borough.



- Public consultation events across 7 towns and online to encourage engagement in the consultation process.




Seven Towns Map with Ealing Children's Centres and other venues

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Community Venues:

Ealing is rich with community activities and potential venues for delivery of services. As part of the Family Hubs Discovery and Consensus phase we developed a bespoke interactive 'Earthlight' map to identify and map locations of venues.

Further work is required to reviews costs for hiring venues, delivery space, equipment and storage.

Consultation Process
