FREE childcare places

Families on a low income either from work or benefits may be eligible for 15 hours a week free childcare for their two-yearolds. Places available at nurseries and with childminders

All three and four-year-old children in the UK are entitled to a free childcare place for 15 hours a week regardless of income or residency status.

Family Information Service (FIS)

The FIS is your first point of contact for all EHAP enquiries. In addition, the FIS can answer family enquiries about:

- Ofsted registered childcare (nurseries, playgroups, childminders etc)
- Paving for childcare
- Free childcare/nursery for two-year-olds
- Family support services
- Leisure activities
- Services for young people
- Services for children with additional needs and disabilities




