ADOPTION STATEMENT

In accordance with Regulations 14 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Ealing adopted the Planning New Garden Space SPD and Southall Gateway SPD as part of its Local Plan on the 9th June 2015.

In summary the two separate SPDs include:

- Planning New Garden Space Formerly known as 'Residential Gardens', this SPD principally serves to amplify policy relating to the provision of new garden provision triggered by development, and provides guidance on the design of new provision, and explains the interface with other forms of open space provision. Stakeholders and the public were consulted on the plan for a 6 week period which closed on 21th April 2014.
- Southall Gateway This SPD forms an update to the adopted Southall OAPF, specifically to chapter 4.2 'Southall Gateway'. The guidance makes clear the Council's requirement for comprehensive development of this important site in order to realise the maximum benefits of the new Crossrail Station. Stakeholders and the public were consulted on the plan for a 6 week period which closed on 24th April 2014.

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the Planning New Garden Space SPD and Southall Gateway SPD may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate powers and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made by no later than the end of the period of six weeks from the date of the adoption of the Planning New Garden Space SPD and Southall Gateway SPD (i.e. by 21st July 2015).
